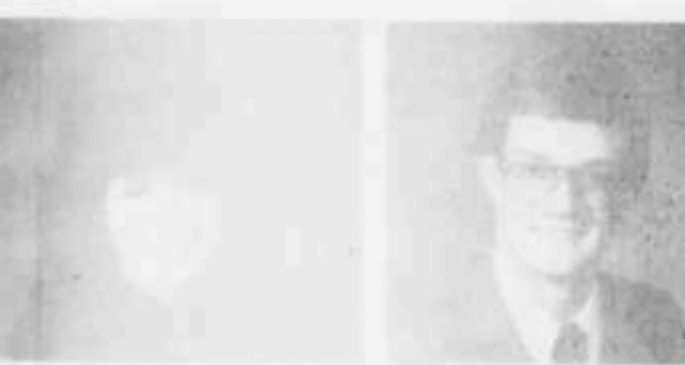

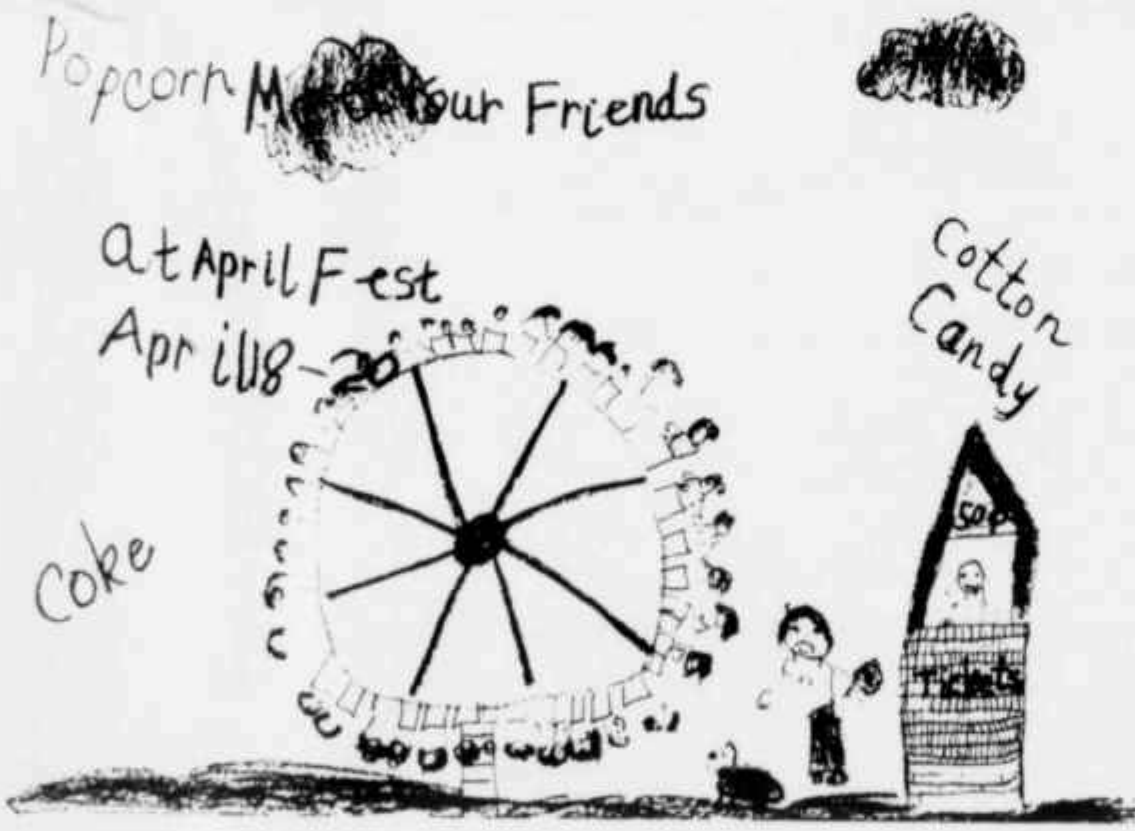

Prairie Edge Museum Notes

Thanks again to all of you who by your hard work and by your generosity in both donating and buying, caused us to net around \$2,200 at our recent garage sale. This money certainly can be put to good use toward meeting needs of our museum. Our special thanks to Mary Lee Szymanski who was chairman of the sale. We do not plan another such sale for 1986, but keep us in mind for at least one big one in 1987.

How many of you readers ever saw cotton being carded? I remember seeing a card at the home of a neighbor in Luling when I was a child. I am not speaking of the kind of card used to express messages. This word is a homograph. (I hope former students of mine will remember that a homograph is a word having the same spelling as another, but with different meaning and origin.) Now, the card recently loaned to the museum by the Parker family is a toothed instrument for combing cotton, wool, flax, etc. By combing out the seeds, cotton, for example, can be readily used in quilt making. The card belong to the late Della Alley. To more interesting items loaned by the Parker family are an old doll bed and a wash stand including a rub board. These toys belonged to the late Martha Parker.

I had such a pleasant surprise about ten days ago when I received a call from Mary Bea Konvicka Arnold in Gonzales. She had been reading my museum notes and decided to call me. She is the curator of the Gonzales Memorial Museum. You will be able to find it easily on 90A that goes through town. I have visited this very interesting museum. Many people know that Gonzales played a big role in the Texas of 1836. I was privileged to be Mary Bea's English teacher during her senior year at Eagle Lake High School. For a number of years she worked at Station KCTI (145.0) in Gonzales. Her husband Travis Arnold, also formerly of Eagle Lake, has been in business in Gonzales for about twenty-five years.

Lorease Carey Priemeyer and her husband Ed are two of our most faithful "fans" and generous in their donating and lending. Lorease recently made some interesting contributions to the special Eagle Lake High School display case. One of these is her senior class ring of 1932, and along with the ring are copies of the programs for the Commencement Exercises and the Senior play titled "Easy Pickin's." He also gave us the 1928 Grammar School (better known now as Middle School) Commencement Program. The class pin was also donated and is quite elaborate. The program listed the singing of "Highways are Happy Ways" by the Boys' Chorus and the Girls' Chorus. Terry Daniels Stedman has loaned us a 1961 Eagle. I spent many interesting hours as advisor for The Eagle from the fall of 1953 through the spring of 1960.

Surely none of you have expected memorabilia from our Centennial year of 1936. We would be so happy for you to loan it to us to display in a special case. I hope to write very soon about a very interesting fact I learned concerning the positioning of the star atop the San Jacinto Monument. I believe I am becoming a Texas History buff.
