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City nixes Frazar land purchase; to improve current airport facilities

After spending an hour listening to comments and suggestions from 35 residents who packed Tuesday night's city council meeting, and another hour in a closed executive session, council adopted a motion calling for improvements in the municipal airport without extending the runway. The vote on the motion was 4-1, with councilman Case Hollub casting the dissenting vote and explaining that he favored the runway extension.

The motion did not include purchasing any land for extending the runway, thus the city's option to buy 20 acres from Joe N. Frazar expires May 28 without being exercised.

Improvements that could be made apparently follow suggestions made more than a year ago by the state aeronautical commission. Mayor Larry Powers explained that the council agreed to improve security on the airport land controlled by the city, which presumably means fencing the property. He also said the city has been talking with the county and is asking that a road be built from FM 3013 to the airport to provide truck access. This, he said, is needed to keep the heavy fertilizer trucks off of city streets. Powers said he feels the county will treat the request positively.

The mayor also said the current runway will be improved, and that the city will attempt to improve the economy of the facility by encouraging the building of hangars and other aircraft services.

Council's action appears to be a compromise suggestion from councilman Mike Duarte who brought up the idea in the council airport committee meeting held prior to the 7:30 p.m. start of the regular council meeting. That committee also discussed other options, including extending the purchase option for \$1,000 a month, or even leasing from Frazar the land needed for the runway extension for \$350 a month.

At the committee meeting, and again in the public council session, Dan Thornton, speaking for David Wintermann, said Mr. and Mrs. Wintermann would donate \$80,000 cash to the city if Frazar would donate the land for the runway. Frazar apparently would not agree.

During the public debate on the issue, several interesting points were brought up. Bob Ashby commented that had the bond issue been approved, there would have been enough additional land transactions and other economic development to have paid for the land and improvements in three years. He added that something like that could not be put in writing until such work was completed.

Ashby also said that he understood the owner of the land picked as the site for the proposed Sealy regional airport had asked Sealy to buy the land within a few days, or he was withdrawing the land from the market.

Many people spoke for the Eagle Lake airport improvements, including Paulette Klockman who presented a petition calling for the purchase of the land. There were 326 names on one petition of registered voters, and on another there were 23 names of business owners who are not voters here. The list included Mr. Wintermann who Thornton said asked his name be withdrawn from support of the purchase. Others spoke against the issue, including T.J. Smith who recommended the city not use reserve funds for the land purchase. Elmer Struss again stressed that he favored airport improvements, but not at the expense of taxpayers, and made a suggestion along the lines of the council action.

In a related development, John Garza, representing Farm and Ranch Aerial Service, petitioned council to allow the business to purchase an abandoned alley near their hangar space. A council committee will recommend purchase price. Garza said he wants to remove an old T-hanger from the property, and construct a "pretty nice" hangar where they could offer aircraft repair services.

In other business, council:

- Approved the third and final reading of an ordinance that will make the intersection at Lake and Davitt streets a four-way stop. The signs will be installed next week.
- Tentatively approved a parade route for the Juneteenth celebration. The parade is planned to begin on Main St. at the intersection of Lake St., move east on Main and turn south onto McCarty to the Recreation Center. The route will receive complete approval if the state highway department approves use of the state and federal highways involved.
