News from Wintermann Library

Jim Reeves grew up in Carthage in East Texas. He was one of the best baseball players in town. He also was one of the best singers.

After pitching for the University of Texas and a couple of minor league teams, he worked as a disc jockey for a Henderson radio station and later used his wonderful voice to sing and record country songs. Before long the mellow voice of Jim Reeves was heard on the "Louisiana Hayride" and later "The Grand Ole Opry" in Nashville.

He recorded one hit record after another such as "Four Walls" and "He'll Have to Go" - and was at the height of his popularity at age forty-one when he was killed in a plane crash on July 31, 1964. From Ron Sime's Book of Texas Days.
