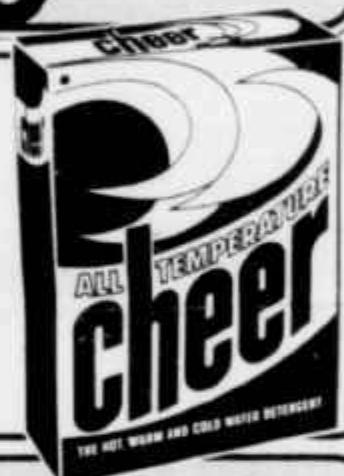

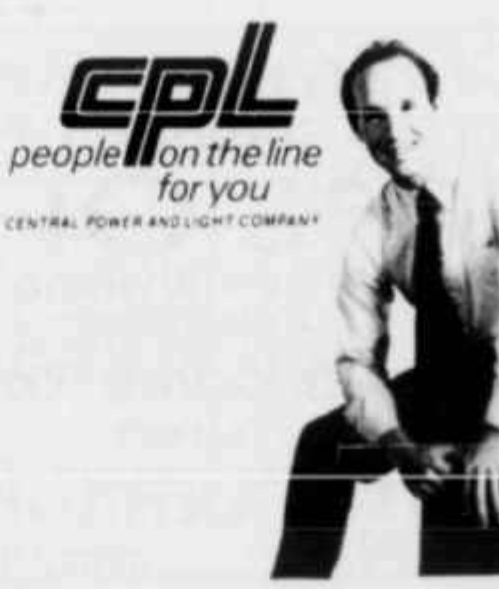
ELECTRIC COSTS
