Where descriptions herein refer to Deed Records or other records, such references are to volumes and pages in the specified records of the County named in the caption hereof, and to such records referred to herein reference is made for all purposes.

YOU ARE HEREBY COMMANDED to appear and defend each suit listed herein in which you are named as a Defendant on the first Monday after the expiration of forty-two (42) days after the date of issuance of this citation which is set out above, before said honorable District Court in the courthouse of said county, then and there to show cause why judgment should not be rendered for such taxes, interest, penalties, attorney fees and costs, and condemning said property and ordering foreclosure of the constitutional and statutory tax liens thereon for taxes due the Plaintiff, any other taxing units and those others who may intervene herein, together with all interest, penalties, attorney fees and costs allowed by law up to and including the day of judgment herein.
