East Bernard ISD lunch prices

The lunch prices for the 1986-87 school year at East Bernard Independent School District will remain the same as last year. They are as follows:

Lunch - \$1 for kindergarten through eighth grade; \$1.25, grades 9-12; 40 cents, reduced-price lunches (K-12); \$1 snack bar (students), junior high (7th and 8th grades); \$1.25 snack bar (students) high school; 20 cents, extra milk; 25 cents, ice cream; \$1.75, all adult lunches with tea (including snack bar).

Breakfast - 50 cents, K-12th grade; 30 cents, reduced-price (K-12); 80 cents, adults. Breakfast serving time will be between 7:30 to 8 a.m.

There will be no charging allowed in the lunchroom for breakfast or lunch. This includes adults as well as students.
