FACIAL PAIN IN MOTORCYCLISTS

With the onset of cooler weather, dentists around the country especially in colder climates usually have an influx of young adult patients complaining of severe facial pain. A little research will find that most of these patients are motorcyclists who have recently ridden their cycles without any face protection from the wind. The pain usually involves both sides of the face and sets in about two hours after the motorcycle ride. It will be a constant, rather than intermittent pain. It will be located in the tooth area of the face which is why these patients usually make a bee line to the dentist. The cause has nothing to do with the teeth but rather the sensitivity of the branches of the trigeminal nerve. The pain will be severe enough for many patients to ask to have some teeth therapy, however, it is for motorcyclists a severe face protection during cold weather.
