Children entering school should be immunized

Texas children who lack proper immunizations will not only be turned away from school, they and their parents may face medical and economic problems, a Baylor College of Medicine pediatrician warns.

Texas law requires that all children entering public schools be immunized for diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis (whooping cough), red measles, mumps, rubella and polio.

"We may think of childhood diseases as minor and something we've all lived through," said John Zahradnik, M.D., assistant professor of immunology and microbiology at Baylor. "However, not only do some children not live through them, others may suffer permanent physical and mental damage if infected."

Another reason for immunizations is to avoid the economic impact of illness.

"Although the vaccines may be expensive, the cost is nowhere near the expense of hospitalization, lost work wages, the potential harm to a child and the worry parents suffer if a child

is affected by one of these diseases," Zahradnik said.

Children entering Texas schools for the first time must show proof of receiving a Rubella (German measles) is measles/mumps/rubella vaccine, and five doses each of the oral polio vaccine and the diphtheria/tetanus/pertussis (DTP) vaccine.

He added that children should be immunized before the school rush begins. Parents who wait until the last minute may be faced with long lines at health clinics.

Even pre-school age children should be vaccinated, Zahradnik said, because they may contract these diseases at day care centers or from infected playmates or family members.

Red measles is very contagious and causes a skin rash and respiratory problems which can

lead to pneumonia. Encephalitis and meningitis, both of which can cause brain damage and death, may also result.

Pertussis can cause suffocation, pneumonia and permanent lung and brain damage.

Mumps causes swelling of the salivary glands in the jaw and may affect the testes or ovaries and lead to sterility.

Tetanus is an often fatal disease that attacks nerve cells in the spinal cord, which controls muscle movement. Muscle spasms of the throat and chest can cause suffocation.

Diphtheria causes swelling of the throat and tonsils which can lead to suffocation.

As for St. Mary's school itself, classes begin for the year Thursday August 28. Teacher in-service days began August 21.

Principal Schoellmann said she tries to match the St. Mary's calendar somewhat with the public school calendar for the convenience of parents with students in both systems. Therefore, she has to start classes at St. Mary's a few days before public school starts on Sept. 2.

New for the school this year is Sally Kallina who will be teaching fifth and sixth grades. There are new part-time staff members Virginia Korenek, an aide, and Grace Korenek, the new secretary taking the place of Mrs. Helen Berger who retired.

Marsha Priemeyer is back as 7th and 8th grade teacher, Sister Linda, S.S.S.F. (School Sisters of St. Francis) will teach first and second grade; Mrs. Schoellmann will teach third and fourth grade, and Mary Ann Gold is the religion coordinator. Msgr. Victor Schmidzinsky is superintendent, and will offer some religion classes.

Dr. Cody again will be the band instructor for the fifth to 8th graders, and Bernice Popp will teach the 3rd and 4th grade rhythm band, and music for other grades. New books to be used this year include science and social studies for all grades, and math for grades three and four. Computer usage is being extended down to the first graders this year too.

The usual PTC Fall Carnival date is in limbo this year, Mrs. Schoellmann said. It usually is held the first of November but that now conflicts with the opening of hunting season and may be rescheduled. The annual softball tournament is scheduled for the last Sunday in April. The annual Christmas program probably will be held December 14.

Principal Schoellmann said she hopes enrollment will increase to 50 students this year, not counting any pre-kindergarten classes. Almost all students live within the St. Mary's Parish.
