Eagle Lake TOPS 15 in '86

TOPS Eagle Lake, TX 697, the Eagle Lake chapter of Take Off Pounds Sensibly, International, has been meeting continuously for 15 years. TOPS was organized in Eagle Lake on May 17, 1971 by a group of five who wanted to lose weight. It grew rapidly and eventually had two job-sharers - one meeting at night and one Spanish speaking. Membership rose and fell over the years, but there has always been a few who kept things going. TOPS is a non-profit organization with reasonable dues (\$15 per year). For these dues the member receives two manuals, a monthly magazine, and weekly meetings. The weekly meeting is an informal group therapy session - a sharing of problems, solutions, low calorie recipes, menus and any other appropriate material. The weekly weigh-in is confidential and the member's weight is known only to that member and the weight recorder, if desired. It is never published. Old members will recall the calorie counting regime (and calories still count), but TOPS has developed a book - A Nutrition Monograph for Taking Off Pounds Sensibly - which is a program of food exchanges. The food is measured and any food in its group may be exchanged as desired without worrying about calories. However, the book includes calories for those who prefer that method. Sample menus at certain calorie levels are given which will lead to success, if adopted, or any other appropriate material. The member may make her own menu with the Monograph as a guide.

TOPS TX 697 meets on Wednesday evenings at 5 at the Episcopal Parish Hall on Stockbridge just off Lake Street. The group welcomes anyone who wants to lose weight or even those who find it hard to maintain their weight level.
