WHAT EVER HAPPENED TO NOVOCAIN?

The vast majority of dental treatments are done with local anesthetics. It's safe and easy to use, and the patient is comfortable and conscious. The whole system is not affected, only a specific area. There are no side effects, such as grogginess, and the loss of sensation in the localized area does not last for a long time after the work is done.

The anesthetic is injected at or near the point where the dentist is going to be working. The nerves in the area are anesthetized - there is a loss of sensation only in a "localized area". The patient can respond to instructions, is conscious of the work being done, but doesn't feel it.

Most people associate local anesthesia with Novocaine (the scientific name is Procaine), which was, in fact, a staple for many years. Nowadays, however, Novocaine is seldom used. We've come a long way in dental anesthesia. Procaine has been replaced by safer and more effective local anesthetics. The most commonly used today is Lidocaine (commercially, called Xylocaine), which is stronger than Procaine and thus, can achieve the same effect with a lesser dosage.

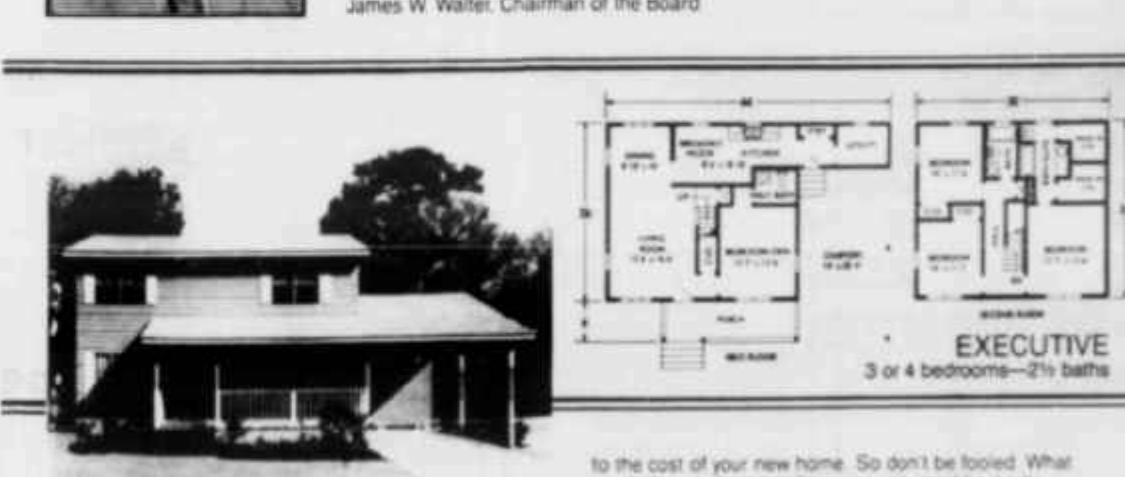
