Moore speaks at Farm Bureau convention

The Colorado County Farm Bureau held its annual convention Tuesday night at 7 p.m. at the Columbus High School cafeteria. Jerry Mikeka, catering, serving approximately 250 guests.

Danette Glueck, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Glueck of Cat Spring, gave a synopsis on the citizenship seminar school. She, Leslie Sunderman and Stacey Causey, both of Eagle Lake, and Alanna Janek of Weimar attended the seminar at San Angelo State University in June of this year.

Other youths recognized were Melissa Engstrom, Farm Bureau queen, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Engstrom of Columbus, and Michael Koehl, Farm Bureau talent find winner, son of Mr. and Mrs. James Koehl of Columbus.

Doyle Moore, the former Colorado County Agricultural Agent (1952-1970), was the guest speaker for the evening, along with Stan White, a humorist from Stephenville.

Butch Strunk, Otto Loessin and Jerome Wick, county commissioners; Leroy Hajdik, county Extension agent; Darrell Appelt of KULM and Stephen Riggs of the Columbus Banner Press were recognized as guests of Farm Bureau. Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth Koehl of Columbus were recently selected for the District XI outstanding young farmer and rancher award by the Texas Farm Bureau. The Koehls will now compete in the state competition and the outcome will be known at the Texas Farm Bureau convention in McAllen.

Teressa Cloot, Emily Frank and Gloria Rice, secretaries for the Colorado County Farm Bureau, received a certificate of excellence from the Texas Farm Bureau for work done on the county Farm Bureau newsletter this year. The award was presented to them at Farm Bureau's annual meeting in Columbus. Recognition is limited to the top 10 percent of county Farm Bureau newsletters in the state.

Criteria for selecting those recognized is based on neatness, local stories, photographs and special Farm Bureau news items. Colorado County Farm Bureau is one of 140 counties that publish one or more newsletters for their members each year.

During the business meeting, reports were submitted and given by the committees. Billy Heffer,

membership chairman, reported that there were 2188 family members of Colorado County Farm Bureau in 1985 and for 1986, 1702 members have renewed their membership and 227 new members have been signed up.

Resolutions that will be submitted to the Texas Farm Bureau are as follows:

1. Colorado County Farm Bureau supports intercross-compliance, but not cross-compliance in the farm program.

2. Colorado County Farm Bureau recommends that USDA pay "in and out" charges for farm storage.

3. Colorado County Farm Bureau recommends that government funds be prevented from being used to assist foreign governments in competing with U.S. exports.

4. Colorado County Farm Bureau recommends that USDA be required to announce all farm programs by November 15 of the previous year.

5. Colorado County Farm Bureau recommends that grains going into loan in farmer-owned storage should receive 100% payment on the amount stored instead of just the 90% now received.

6. Colorado County Farm Bureau recommends that a previous winner of a district queen or talent find contest not be allowed to compete in subsequent years.

7. Colorado County Farm Bureau recommends that TFB commodity advisory committee terms be adjusted to 4-year terms.

8. Whereas the State of Art in Alcohol and Drug Abuse Detection and Treatments have improved dramatically in the last ten (10) years and whereas Farm Bureau in the past has supported the SWI legislation that utilized these improvements (example, DWI court classes) and whereas alcohol related traffic deaths are down 25% since 1980, be it resolved that Farm Bureau policy in our insurance companies should reflect this phenomenal in what we pay for our insurance and who is allowed to participate in our policies.

As our membership ages, it becomes harder to write policies for them and the last thing we need to do is to reduce our bases of younger members making it harder to carry our older members as long as we can.
