Kindergarten classes participate in 'heart treasure chest day'

Governor Mark White proclaimed September 23 as Heart Treasure Chest Day and the Eagle Lake Primary kindergarten classes participated in a special statewide event "kicking off" the distribution of the Heart Treasure Chest to all elementary schools in the state. Chests will arrive in schools from October through January.

This event is an innovative hands-on teaching tool designed to reach heart-health concepts and practices to pre-kindergarten and kindergarten children. Through a grant from the Houston Endowment, the American Heart Association is distributing chests to elementary schools across the state, over 3,000 in all.

On September 23, pre-kindergarten and kindergarten teachers and students all across the state simultaneously learned about heart health. The lesson was taught from 9:45 to 10 a.m. to coincide with events taking place on the grounds of the State Capitol.
