### Landowners asked to cooperate in deer survey

Texas landowners who received antlerless deer hunting permits or tags during the past hunting season are being asked to assist the Parks and Wildlife Department with an ongoing harvest survey.  
 "All landowners who received permits also received a questionnaire card," said Mike Reagan, assistant wildlife management biologist. "The card asks for harvest information about deer, turkey and javelina."  
 The survey should provide valuable data about the overall harvest in each county, Reagan noted, and he added that landowners are being asked to return the postage-paid card even if no harvest occurred during the season.  
 Results of the survey will be used in proposing future hunting regulations, Reagan said.

### Ruben Salinas is recipient of Tenneco's service award

Ruben Salinas, the son of Joe and Nancy Salinas of Eagle Lake, was named the 1986 winner of the Tenneco Oil Processing and Marketing community service award. ### Tips on establishing new pastures

 Forage and livestock producers making plans for establishing new pastures in the spring might want to consider a few pointers.  
 First, decide whether you want the grass to do a single grass that stays green 365 days a year, grows well during drought and cold weather, produces good forage all year long, and provides a high yield.  
 Be realistic in selecting the grass for your new pasture. Consider if you want the grass strictly for grazing or if hay will be harvested during times of lush growth. Also consider root growth and its effect on conserving soil and water resources. Response to fertilizer is an important factor in most areas of Texas.  
 While costs are important, consider long-term benefits of production and persistence before opting for the least expensive pasture to establish.  
 The most popular grass being planted is coastal bermudagrass. Kleingrasses such as Verda and Kleingrass 75 are very popular for use to heavy soil types. Gordo Bluegrass is popular on the heavy loam soils.  
 For establishing stands, growers should prepare the seedbed well in advance of planting. This permits soil to settle and become firm before planting. Weeds can be controlled and fertilizer should be applied before seedbed is ready. All plantings should be rolled after planting to help level and firm the soil.  
 Most failures of new plantings is important for determining what results from short-term plans and pasture decisions to prepare seedbeds, remember that grass seeds and sprigs are small and seedlings are weak. No conditions must be favorable for germination and establishment.  
 WJCJ registrar Albert Barnes notes a significant departure from prior years when spring enrollment has normally dropped from 150 to 200 students below fall numbers. Fall term enrollment for 1986 was 2350, only 46 more than are registered this spring.  
 Fulltime enrollment has jumped from 1251 in 1986 to 1464. Part-time student registration is up from 729 to 840. Thirty-six percent of the Spring 1987 student body are part-time collegians. Six percent are first-time students according to statistics provided by Jim Dobbins, director of management support and systems analyst at Wharton County Junior College. Coeds now comprise 65 percent of the total number of part-time students and 55 percent of the fulltime student count. Ethnic groupings remain the same with 15% hispanic, 12% black and 73% white or other.
