Dulany Funeral Home removed the bodies about two hours after the accident. Later that day the federal authorities ordered an autopsy... the couple and Larry Dulany took the bodies to the Harris County Morgue. Dulany said when he arrived in Houston, there was a long delay since officials there said the FAA had no authority to order an autopsy in Harris County. The morgue finally accepted the bodies.

Access to the crash site was difficult, because of the rough rice field. Later in the afternoon a tractor from Bob Cook's farming operation plowed a path to the airplane to make access easier. The sight was viewed Saturday evening so the federal investigators could study the wreckage Sunday before it was moved.
