Johnson to chair wildlife committee

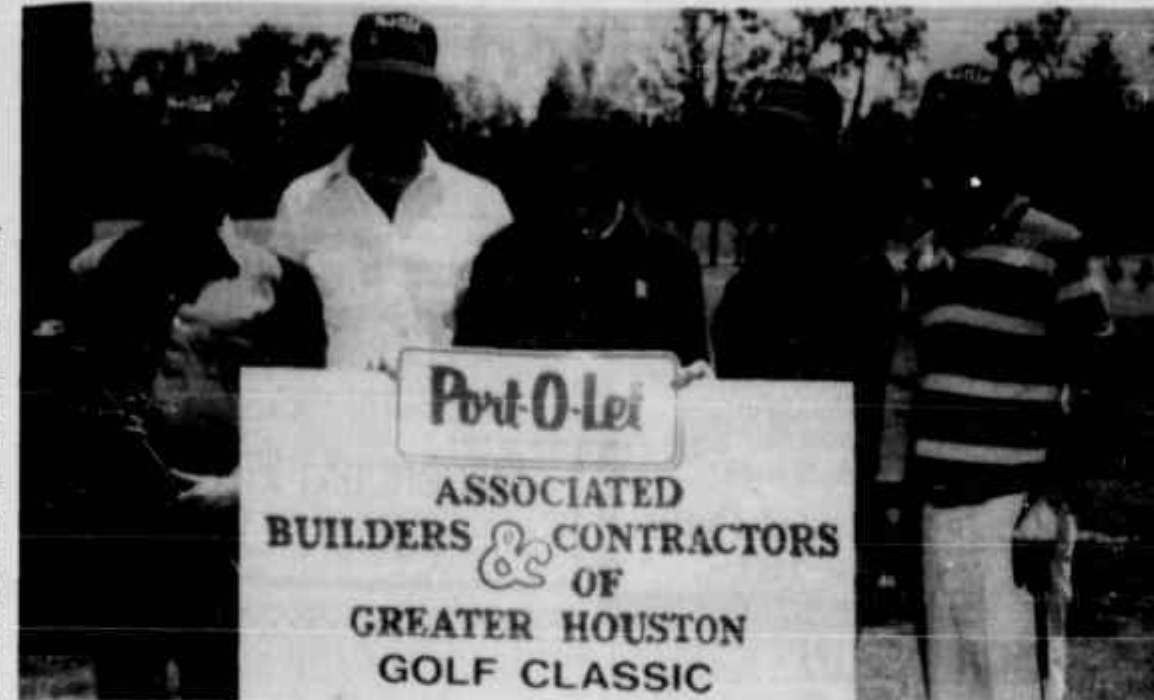
John Engstrom, president of Colorado County Farm Bureau, announced the appointment of Paul Johnson, of Columbus, as chairman of the newly formed Wildlife Committee. Also on the committee are Russell Trefny, of Weimar, and Billy Hefner, of Garwood.

According to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Dept., numerical statistics are not kept on all wildlife populations so major producing counties would be impossible to pinpoint. Therefore, the board has decided that TFB should establish a wildlife division to encompass all species of wildlife after at least 30 county Farm Bureaus establish county wildlife divisions.

Crime statistics for Eagle Lake

Crimes in Texas for the calendar year of 1986 were released from the Uniform Crime Reporting, crime records division, Texas Department of Public Safety. For the county, the report is as follows:

The Colorado County Sheriff's Department reported one rape, 12 aggravated assaults, 91 burglaries, 80 thefts, 11 motor vehicle thefts with a total crime index of 195 for the 12 month reporting period. The Columbus Police Department had one murder, one robbery, four aggravated assaults, 22 burglaries, 38 thefts, 5 motor vehicle thefts with a total crime index of 71. The Eagle Lake Police Department reported two murders, two rapes, two robberies, 25 aggravated assaults, 69 burglaries, 151 thefts and 14 motor vehicle thefts. The total crime index of 265 for a 12 month reporting period for Eagle Lake is one less than the entire county and Columbus combined.

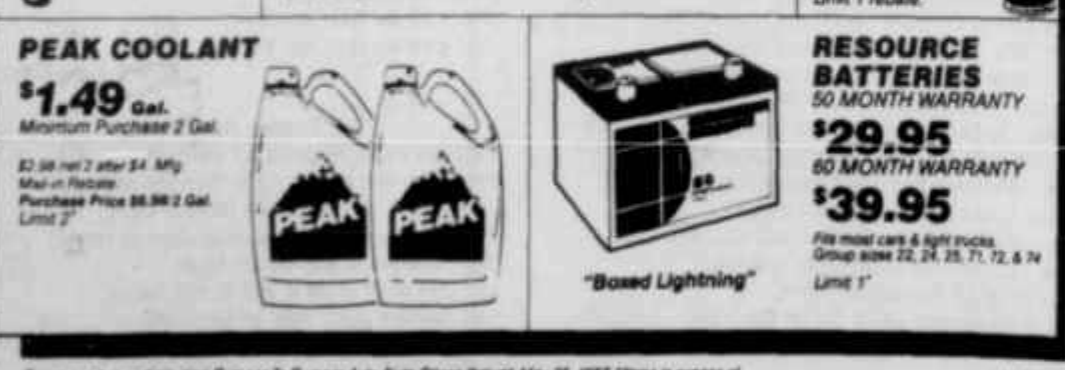
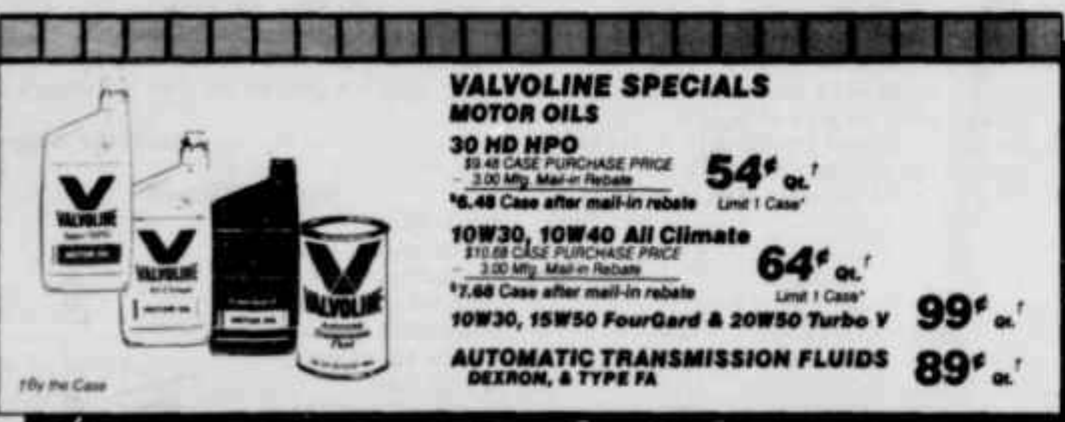
