Crack: most addictive form of cocaine

(The following story was furnished by Ben Johnson, Eagle Lake chief of police, and Buford Ashley, police officer for Eagle Lake.)
Events of the past year have focused the nation's attention on drug abuse. The attention has been focused on ways to combat increases in the number of users and on ways to eventually eradicate drug abuse in the United States. This article will attempt to provide some information to those in law enforcement who have had little or no contact with a particular form of drug abuse—smoking crack. Since crack is a form of cocaine we should begin our investigation with crack by discussing the drug cocaine.
Cocaine is an alkaloid obtained from the South American coca plant. Cocaine first became popular in the United States in the 19th century. During this period Parke-Davis, a U.S. pharmaceutical company, sold at least 15 products that contained cocaine. These products included cigarettes and cigars. The original Coca-Cola was bottled with a dash of cocaine. Presently cocaine has been banned from use in all products manufactured in the U.S. The medical profession has generally discontinued the use of cocaine as a local anesthetic. However, the use of cocaine as a "recreational" drug has skyrocketed. A 1985 study by the National Institute on Drug Abuse stated that there are currently 5 million regular cocaine users in America. Other studies show that while the number of users of other drugs has diminished, the number of cocaine users may be partially attributed to the highly addictive qualities of the drug.
Many doctors now believe that cocaine is the most addictive popular drug of all, and crack is by far its most

Second special session may be needed

State Capitol Highlights

Lawmakers are speculating that a second special session will be needed to balance the state budget with a new tax plan. The current session closes July 21.
After the plan to tax insurance policies blew up in the Senate last week, scuttled by thousands of consumer protests, the leadership searched for new revenue sources and found nothing on which they could agree.
First, lawmakers must agree on how much to spend, and the budget committee labor all week to force a compromise before time runs out next week.
Pro-tax legislators took some hope from Gov. Bill Clements' softening stance on new taxes, if it can be called that.
Clements indicated he may not veto a tax bill so long as the budget is balanced. "If they put that bill on my desk, I assure you I would sign it. So there is a bottom line," he said.

Mixed signals up
The next day, the governor retook his position against taxes after meeting with a group of Houston businessmen.
Clements' signals are mixed, and he is steadily fading for that and for his failure to hold press conferences. On his side, he received mixed signals, too, from a Legislature that has neither a budget nor a tax plan.

Hobby and Mattox
In recent weeks, Mattox has stepped up his political attacks on his probable 1990 gubernatorial opponent, Lt. Gov. Bill Hobby.
Mattox paints Hobby as a rich man who lies to go fox hunting and is out of touch with common people. Mattox calls Hobby "The People's Lawyer."

Last week, Hobby finally retorted and said Mattox was a weak candidate, maybe the weakest, for the governor's post or any other post, since he barely squeaked by his Republican opponent last November.
"The way he's campaigned against me in a personal way disqualifies him for the nomination," Hobby said.

Mattox wasn't silenced. He said he is tired of cleaning up the mess made by the Legislature, a thesis valued at Hobby.
Loeffler, Contreras
The Republican who could run that same race, former Congressman Tom Loeffler, last week became President Reagan's chief lobbyist for the Co. tras and other Central American affairs.

The po. not only takes Loeffler out of his law office and back into politics, but provides a tie to conservative Texas Hispanics. Loeffler said he will work for continued aid to the Nicaraguan Contras.
