- The market continues to strengthen each week with mostly quality steer calves seeking mostly \$1 to \$3 a hundred higher and heifer calves \$2 to \$4 a hundred higher. Demand was good in all areas with both kinds popular. A lighter run of cattle were on hand following a few scattered shorthorns, says George Hagan and Don McAlister.

oats and ryegrass planted during September have the best opportunity for

- oats and ryegrass planted during September have the best opportunity for early grazing and maximum production for the season provided optimum rainfall and temperature conditions exist. The planting has already enhanced the opportunity to plant early on a prepared seedbed. Preplant applications of a balanced fertilizer prior to or at planting is very essential for quick development of oats, ryegrass or wheat. The seedling needs both the phosphate and potash should be applied at or prior to planting along with the seed.

The fertilizer should be disced into the soil during the final seedbed preparation.

- The fertilizer should be dispersed into the soil during the final seedbed preparation or knifed into the soil a time of planting. Additional nitrogen may be applied as the crop shows need for it.
- This is usually in January to early February.

- Regrass varieties**
- Regrasses planted on a prepared seedbed should establish as early as grazing as oats if planted in the 30 lbs. of seed per acre and all growing and fertility conditions are equal. Demonstrations have also shown that a mix of 10-15 pounds of regrass and two bushels of alfalfa per acre will excite root growth.
- The regrass goes winter freeze-out

Although the human body continues to change throughout life, changes in the adult occur much more slowly than in the child and are called "maturing features." In most people, the middle, autumn and later years of life are characterized by a thinning and sharpening of the facial contour. During these years, the support provided by intact teeth is critically important in maintaining a symmetrical and pleasing facial appearance.

The teeth, especially the front teeth (incisors) and the eye teeth (canines), provide direct support to the shape of the face, corner of the mouth and front part of the cheeks. If these teeth are not replaced immediately, their loss can cause or accentuate hollowing, drooping and hollowing of the facial tissues resulting in facial features that are less attractive and downright unpleasant.

In the older person, loss of the back teeth and molars (back teeth) accentuates the hollow configuration of the face, deepens the wrinkles around the eyes and wrinkles. You only have one face. Don't let negligence keep it from looking as young as you are for life. Replace any missing teeth now!
