New chemistry system equipment purchased for Eagle Lake hospital

The Cobas Mira Chemistry System, tagged "The army of one," has been ordered for the Eagle Lake Community Hospital's laboratory to replace an antiquated piece of equipment, announces the hospital's administrator, Jack Harrell. The baby-to-use Chemistry System performs profiles, electrolytes, organ panels, ionized calcium, therapeutic drug monitoring and special chemistries.

And, because Cobas Mira is a patient - directed random access system, STAT (emergency situation) testing can be requested and performed at any time without disturbing routine test workflow. 104 test channels can be tailored to meet your specific testing needs. Costs are minimized through procedural efficiency, automation and use of reagent microvolumes.

The Eagle Lake Community Hospital Auxiliary will donate \$30,000 toward the purchase of the Chemistry Auto Analyzer. It was noted that with such a large down payment, a considerable discount will be realized.

Previously, consideration was given to a system of less value and with less capabilities, but after much study, it was decided to purchase the superior analyzer, Cobas Mira, which with discount will cost approximately \$55,000. It will be installed in October of this year.

The Pink Ladies are in charge of raising and collecting funds for this project and are now accepting charitable donations. Names of donors (not amount) will be listed each week in the Headlight.
