'Tis the season for thieves

Although it is "The Season to be Jolly," many area residents will find the holiday season to be less than jolly because of negligence and carelessness, according to Major William F. Maley, regional commander of the Texas Department of Public Safety.

Three things are almost certain to be a part of the season: homes and apartments will be filled with gifts; families taking trips to be with loved ones and friends; and a skyrocketing crime rate.

The following suggestions are offered by Major Maley as precautions you can and should take to avoid turning this joyous time into an unpleasant or tragic memory.

Start with your home. Make sure that you lock all doors and windows whether you are in the house or not. If you leave, don't leave a key outside in a great hiding place. Burglars, even amateurs, know all the usual and unusual hiding places.

Do not make your affluence known. If you do put your Christmas tree in front of a large window, be sure that the gifts are not easily visible from the outside.

If your holiday plans include a trip, have home deliveries discontinued and have a trusted friend or neighbor look after your home. A collection of newspapers in the front yard is a beacon to burglars.

Plan a safe trip. Get plenty of rest the night before you leave. Allow plenty of time to arrive at your destination. Don't attempt to "make up" lost time due to unexpected delays. It is much better to arrive late than not to arrive at all. Take a break every two hours or each 100 miles to avoid fatigue. Obey all of the traffic regulations especially those pertaining to speed and make necessary adjustments as dictated by road, weather or traffic conditions. Do not mix alcohol and driving and make sure everyone is using their safety belts.

Be sure to lock the doors and remove the keys when you leave your car. Don't tempt thieves by leaving packages on the seat or in plain view. Put gifts and luggage in the trunk, safely out of sight.

The crime of robbery also increases during this season, but there are several things you can do to avoid becoming a victim. If you shop at night, don't go alone and park in a well-lighted area. Check the interior of your vehicle for intruders and have your keys ready to allow quick entry. Shoppers should be careful not to show large amounts of cash when making purchases.

Every holiday season, hundreds of people become victims of crime of motor vehicle accidents. Many of these occurrences can be eliminated if these simple precautions are heeded.

Seasonal traditions should include safety

Stockings hanging all in a row above a glowing fire, gifts stacked below a twinkling Christmas tree — these are some of the traditions of the holiday season we look forward to enjoying each year.

"Taking the time now to review a few precautions," he said, "will help assure your family a happy and safe holiday season."

The tree

If you prefer the natural touch of a real tree, make sure it is fresh and green. Shake the tree to see if needles fall out, an indication that it is too dry.

The decorations

Look for the Underwriters Laboratory (UL) label when you purchase a string of lights. Check your old lights for frayed or bare wires, cracked sockets or bulbs and loose connections. Don't overload your circuits with too many lights; the wiring could overheat, starting a fire. Decorations should be flameproof and made of noncombustible materials. Breakable ones need to be placed high on the tree out of reach of small children and pets.

Plan parties to beat the 'day after' blues

By taking some practical steps you can put together a holiday party that won't leave your friends regretting what they ate and drank the night before.

"People often try to eat light and avoid the obvious hazards of drinking and driving, but don't want to make an issue of it at a party," says Dr. Alice Hunt, Texas A&M nutritionist.

"Having an appropriate assortment of party foods and beverages allows guests to avoid the hangover or bad feelings about overeating that may follow the next day."

Hunt offers these suggestions to party-givers:

- Offer plenty of high protein and carbohydrate foods like cheese, meats, raw vegetables and crackers. These foods stay in the stomach longer, which slows the rate at which the body absorbs alcohol.
- Be more concerned about keeping the plates filled than the glasses. When guests nibble on food, it tends to slow the amount of alcohol they consume.
- For friends who are dieting, offer plenty of attractive, lower-calorie foods, such as vegetable sticks and fresh fruit cubes and lean meats. Guests who eat little or nothing and

like candles to bathe a room in an old-fashioned glow, they can also start a good old-fashioned fire. Keep them out of the reach of children, out of drafts and away from draperies, and other easily ignited items.

Don't deck your halls with boughs of holly that are draped around candles. Keep wreaths and other trimmings away from flame.

The fireplace, wood stove

In many parts of Texas, the yule log is the first fire of the season. Before starting a fire, make sure the chimney and flue lining are in good working order and free of blockage. Colored newspapers and wrapping paper should not be burned because they may contain lead.

Use a screen in front of the fireplace and never leave a fire burning unattended or overnight. Dispose of ashes in a closed metal container outside the house.

Be prepared. Keep a fully charged fire extinguisher handy. Every member of the family should be familiar with its location and how to operate it. Don't put it next to the tree; you may not be able to reach it when you need it.

Keep emergency numbers next to the phone. The hotter things get, the harder it is to keep your cool; those reminders can be life savers.

If you don't already have them, install smoke detectors, especially in halls leading to bedrooms and be sure the batteries are fresh. Smoke and poisonous gases can overcome sleeping people long before they are aware of a fire.

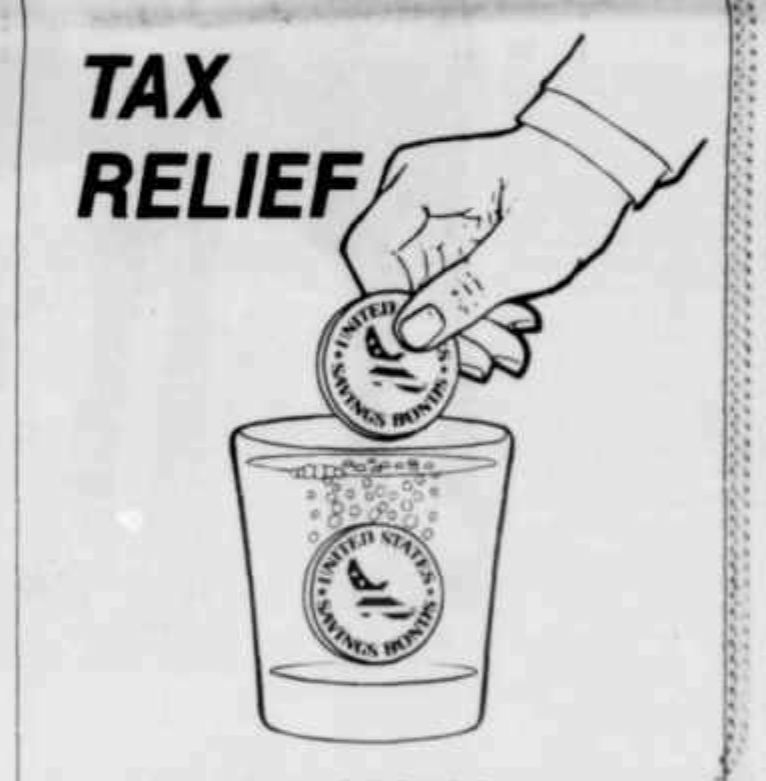
