Texas hay prospects 'optimistic'

Texas hay producers presently are optimistic concerning price prospects as the New Year approaches, says Dr. Robert "Bud" Schwartz.

Prices in October averaged \$4.50 per ton higher for all types of hay across Texas from year earlier levels, says Schwartz, an economist in dairy marketing.

Supply and demand of hay are highly variable across the state, he adds.

Total production of Texas alfalfa in 1987 was down 1.5 percent from 1986 levels, prompting shortages in some areas.

"Competition for good quality alfalfa among cattle feeders and dairy producers is pushing alfalfa prices up. In Northeast Texas, dairy producers are paying around \$150 per ton for high quality alfalfa delivered to the farm. Variability in the 1987 growing season, and the resulting changes in supply, has alfalfa growers optimistic about prices continuing at higher levels into the first part of 1988," Schwartz adds.

Some growers are responding by holding supplies back until after the New Year. Some of these same growers also are planning to increase alfalfa acreage in 1988, he says.

Prices for all other types of hay likely will remain good through the first part of 1988, despite larger supplies of grass hay in 1987, he predicts.

Stronger year-end prices for all hay types likely will encourage growers to consider expanding acreages.
