Four Medicines for Peptic Ulcers

An ulcer is an open sore or eroded area on the surface of any organ or tissue. Ulcers that form on the walls of the digestive tract (esophagus, stomach, or small intestine) are commonly referred to as "peptic ulcers."

Peptic ulcers are thought to occur as a result of the secretion of excessive amounts of digestive juices such as hydrochloric acid and pepsinogen.

Antacids are the most commonly used medicines for peptic ulcer relief. Because of the possibility of interactions with other medicines, antacids should be taken two to three hours after taking certain medicines such as tetracycline, theophylline, digoxin, and cimetidine.

Special antihistamines which are referred to as H₂ antagonists reduce the amount of digestive juice secreted into the gastrointestinal tract. The H₂ antagonists include cimetidine and ranitidine.

Coating agents such as sucralfate bind tissue in the gastrointestinal tract, insulating ulcers from the corrosive action of acid.

Anticholinergic agents such as propantheline block the action of acetylcholine, thereby decreasing hydrochloric acid production.
