#### Effectively Reduce Blood Pressure

Many of America's 60 million hypertensives take prescription nedicines to help control their blood pressure. These medicines work in a variety of ways to keep the pressure at a reasonable level. Some medicines dilate blood vessels, causing a drop in the pressure. Other types inhibit special nerve receptors located in the brain. A third category includes medicines which reduce blood pressure by affecting either the amount of blood pumped out of the heart or the amount that is pumped back to the heart.

Another category of medicines that effectively reduce high blood pressure are called ACE inhibitors.
