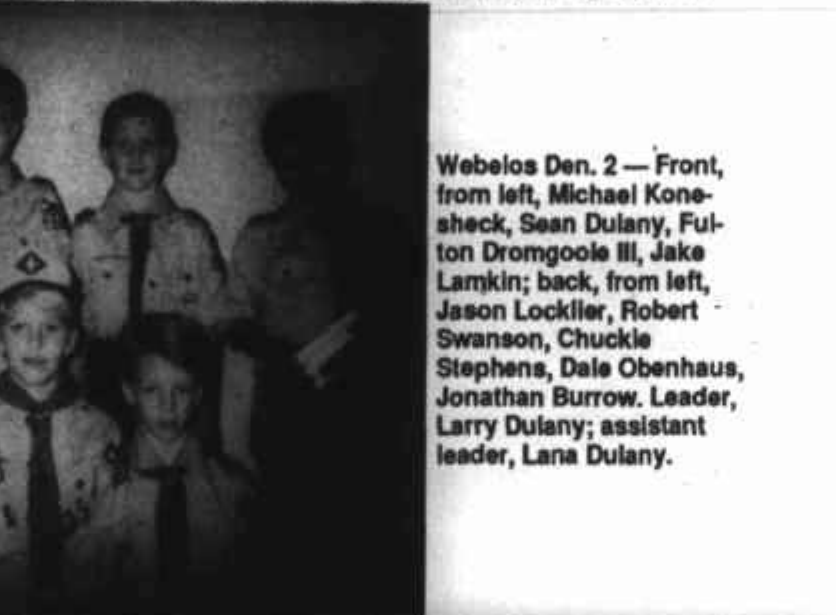

# Jeannette Clift George to speak at Christian Women's Luncheon

The annual Christian Women's Luncheon will be held on March 14 at the First Baptist Church beginning at 10:30 a.m. The speaker for the event this year will be Mrs. Jeannette Clift George.

Jeannette Clift George is the founder and Artistic Director of the A.D. Players, the Houston-based Christian Theater Company which offers plays throughout the world. For her work with the company, Mrs. George received the Matrix Award for outstanding contribution to the community through her playwriting; the Delta Gamma Fraternity Shield Award for distinguished achievement through professional and volunteer

services; and an honorary membership in Alpha Delta Kappa International Teacher's Society. Jeannette Clift's extensive background in professional theater includes acting Off-Broadway and touring with the New York Shakespeare Company. She played several seasons of summer stock in the East, at the Playhouse in the Park in Philadelphia, and at the Arena Stage in Washington. She has performed her one-woman show at the Gramercy Arts Theatre in New York, at Dallas' Theatre III, and at many civic clubs and other venues across the country. In Houston, she was a member of the Alley Theatre's acting company, appearing in many leading roles: Mrs. Campbell in *Dear Liar*, Maggie in *Ring Around the Bathub*, Jean Brodie in *The Prime of Miss Jean Brodie*, the wife in *All Quiet*, the title role in *Cokette*, Juliet's nurse in *Romeo and Juliet*, and Mrs. Malaprop in *The Rivals*. On the Grace Theater stage, the home of the A.D. Players, Mrs. George played the title roles in *Rachel*, *A woman of Masada* by Jewel Gibson and J. Janda's *Julian*, and most recently portrayed Mrs. Carrie Watts in *The Trip to Bountiful*. Her film debut was in *World Wide Pictures' The Hiding Place*, portraying Corrie Terboom, a Dutch woman who saved lives of scores of Jews during the Nazi occupation. Since the general release in 1975, the film has shown to large audiences worldwide. Mrs. George was nominated for a Golden Apple Award by the Holly-

wood Women's Press Club, a Golden Globe Award by the Hollywood Foreign Press Association, and as Most Promising Newcomer by the British Academy of Arts and Sciences. In 1987, she starred in the dramatic video *Broken Victory*, produced by Carstens/Smith Productions, and recorded the cassette version of *Christy*, both distributed by Word, Inc.

Jeannette George is equally well known as a writer, Bible teacher, speaker and monologist. She is the author of two books: *Some Run with Feet of Clay*, published by Manor of Grace, and *Travel Tips from a Reluctant Traveler*, available through Thomas Nelson Publishers. Her speaking engagement and Bible classes throughout the country are varied and range from talks to church groups to formal presentations at national conventions. She is a speaker for the Billy Graham School of Evangelism and a Staley Foundation Distinguished Christian Scholar Lecturer. Her unique teaching style is captured in White Lion Productions' highly acclaimed four-part film series *Travel Tips From a Reluctant Traveler*. This work was nominated for Best Film Series, and Mrs. George was a Best Actress nominee for the Christian Film Distributors Association's Golden Crown Award. Mrs. George celebrates eighteen years of marriage with her husband Lorraine George, a construction engineer, businessman, and her most ardent supporter.
