## 4-H sponsors AIDS education program

As of October, 1989, AIDS had claimed over 66,000 victims: 65,467 adults and adolescents, 1028 children. It is predicted that between 1 to 1.5 million people in the United States have the HIV virus, but no symptoms of the disease. These people are still sexually active, therefore continuing to spread the virus to others.

In addition, the incidence of AIDS has decreased among homosexuals, and increased among heterosexuals. AIDS does not discriminate - it can affect anyone.

In an effort to educate the public

about this dreaded disease, the Colorado County 4-H is sponsoring a public education program titled "AIDS: The Facts". This program will be held on Monday, March 12, at 7 p.m. in the Colorado County Agriculture Building (316 Spring Street, Columbus).

Judy Spong, HIV Coordinator for the Texas Department of Health, Public Health Region IV, will present the program. She will discuss general

information, and then have a question and answer session. Parents and their children are encouraged to attend this informative program. Only through education can we hope to stop the spread of this dreaded disease.
