knew nothing about animals. The finalists were required to go to the banker and get a loan and explain to the New Yorker and media packer everything they know about animals.

Three Rice students were among the 12 finalists — Kim Corman, Sher Sunderman and Louis Mahalic. Winners were announced during the commercial steer banquet Thursday evening in the Herdman's Room at the Astorhall. Special awards, such as outstanding set of record books, rookie of the year and outstanding committeeman, also were given. For the first time this year, each finalist received a Texas shaped plaque for their achievement.

Second place winner of \$500 and a '20' goose-neck trailer was Sarah Wirtz of Brenham. This is the first year in the history of the show that females won the two top positions. Corman, who has competed in the commercial steer division for the past five years, said she has been in the finals the last four times but never placed. She told future exhibitors to never give up and to keep trying each year.

There is tremendous talent shown by students from Rice High School FFA as they have won first and second place many times. Most recently, Bill Hefner won first place and a truck in 1985; Leslie Sunderman won second

and the goose-neck trailer two years in a row, 1986 and 1987. Also, Michael Gramham placed fourth and won the "Rookie of the Year" award last year and Louis Mahalic also received \$500 and was named best herdsman in 1988, not to mention the many other awards and placings won by Rice students.

Other area students participating in the livestock show were as follows: Todd Mascheck of Eagle Lake showed a Short Horn steer named "Bugger" in the steer division, and a Red Angus heifer, which placed second in its weight division. He also participated in the calf scramble February 27, but was unsuccessful.

Todd's steer made the first sift, but didn't make the second sift last Friday. The steer was judged on build, framework and body fat and if it would have been sold on Saturday at the show.

The heifer show on Saturday was based on a point system. Todd said he shows his heifer in as many shows as possible during the year throughout Texas to accumulate points with the Texas Club Calf Association. Participants are awarded a jacket or a belt buckle for their points.

Sarah Fuchs of Weimar showed a Simmental steer and placed 15th in its division and was able to sell her steer.

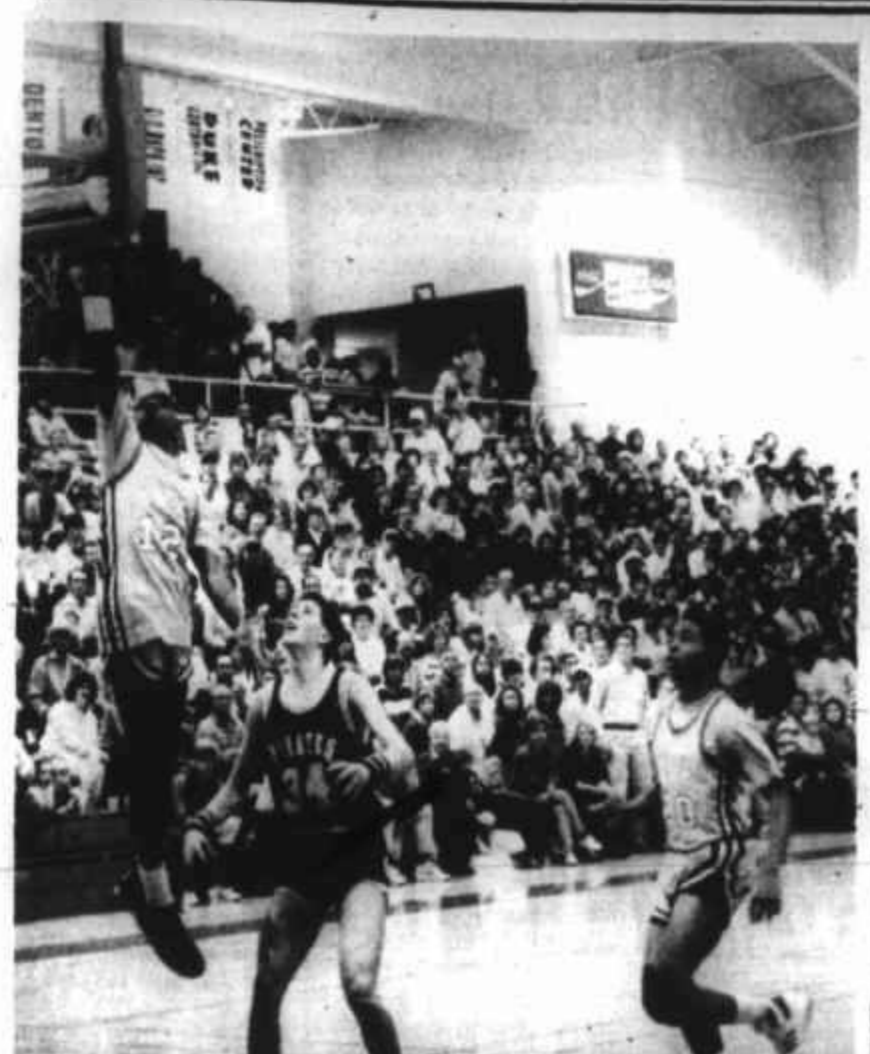

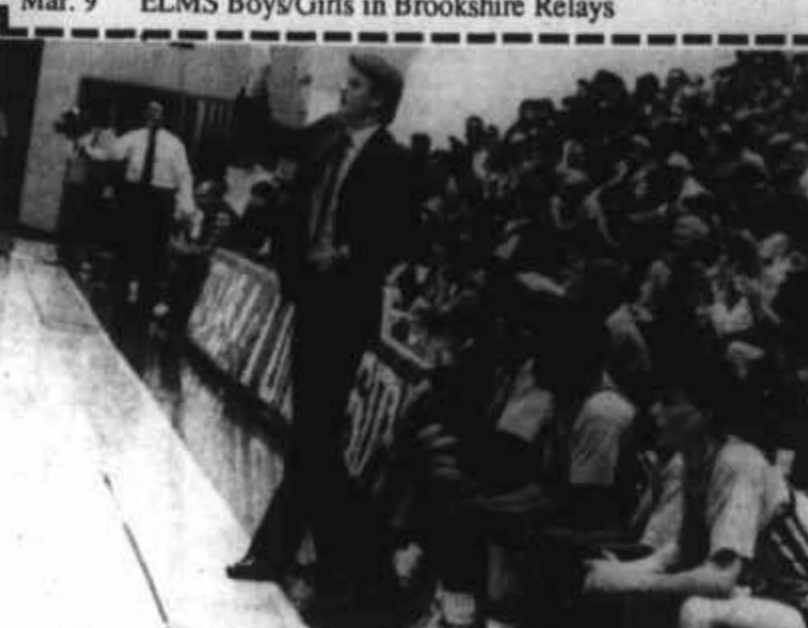
