Anna Lee's 'cup of tea' overflows with hospitality

Anna Lee's Kitchen has been offering custom catering and culinary delights by reservation just for two. With the youngest of their children away at college, Anna Lee found she had too much time and too little to do. She tried to keep active and even volunteered her home for the Christmas home tour the Heritage House sponsored. But by the second week of December she found herself with the house decorated, all presents wrapped and nothing left to do. Anna Lee was too young to retire, so she decided to try something she knew she would enjoy.

Loving to bake, cook and always finding herself right at home in the kitchen, Anna Lee placed an ad in the Headlight offering to do specialty baking for the holidays. The response was overwhelming! After the holidays, Anna Lee didn't want to find herself without enough to keep busy again. She recalled past visits to the grand old plantations of Louisiana where she hasn't been able to pull off.

The specialty baking response convinced her that such a business was needed and would work in this area. While the idea was certainly not new, it was unique for Eagle Lake. Anna Lee opened her kitchen, offering custom food preparation, baking and all types of cuisine (...such as dinner rolls, cinnamon rolls, all kinds of pies, cakes, casseroles and even turkey dinners with all the trimmings). Anna Lee's Kitchen has been a smash hit ever since.

Anna Lee offers a monthly gourmet night by reservation and generally serves between 20 and 30 regulars at the seven course meals. Frank greets guests at the door while Anna Lee is in the kitchen. She does all the cooking herself, with only longtime housekeeper Rita Garcia helping in the preparation work. All her specialties are from recipes she has collected and revised or added to over the years. A few of her regulars have tried to stump her on menu ideas from time to time, but so far they haven't come up with anything she hasn't been able to pull off.

Anna Lee's Kitchen does catering and has traveled as far as Houston to do so. Also, the Higgins home is available for private parties such as weddings, anniversaries, showers and dinners. The home's main dining room can easily seat 30, and the east dining room can accommodate another 25 to 30 guests. Menus for such affairs are not set, Anna Lee prefers to work with the hostess.

"Timing is very important," says Anna Lee. "Over the years Rita and I have become so organized that we can set up for a party of 50 in a matter of minutes. And with very little effort, we can tear down and clean up after that same party in about 10 minutes. If you come by for coffee afterwards, you wouldn't even be able to tell. It's the type of thing that only comes with experience."

April will be the first time that Anna Lee's Kitchen will be open daily, 11 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. Lunch will be served buffet style with a wide variety of edibles. The setting is casual-formal, with a large dose of Texas hospitality... Anna Lee style.

Views On Dental Health

WHAT TO DO WITH WISDOM TEETH

If any of your wisdom teeth are beginning to erupt, the question to be answered by your dentist is "What to do with them?" He may not recommend that they be extracted unless they have become impacted or are crowding other teeth. If that's the case, they should be removed as soon as possible.

Wisdom teeth are a throwback to an age when man's jaws were larger and could accommodate third molars without creating dental problems. Today, however, in many cases wisdom teeth do not break through the gum or are only partially visible. They become impacted, causing damage to second molars and the jawbone, especially when they begin crowding other teeth. However, if any of your wisdom teeth grow in straight and can be maintained in a healthy condition, your dentist may not recommend that they be removed. Only a thorough examination by your dentist will provide the best solution to how your wisdom teeth should be treated.
