The session ended Wednesday, but Gov. Bill Clements will call legislators into a second session to attempt to comply with a Texas Supreme Court order to equalize public school funding.

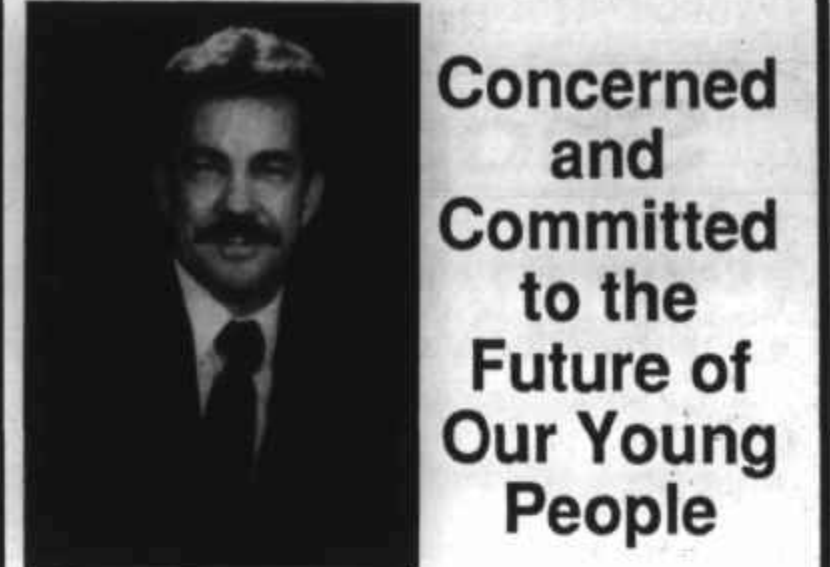
