Many of us in our community have been looking forward to and carrying out plans for our Wildflower Celebration which will begin this Saturday March 31 and continue through April. By calling Vic Scott at 234-2792, you can still get your name on the list of hosts and hostesses who will have the joy of meeting many wonderful people and helping them to know where to go to see the beautiful flowers, how to be included in the wagon rides, where the many booths are located, what our local merchants have to offer, and the names and locations of the many good places to eat. We hope every visitor will have the joy of "touring" our museum where many outstanding exhibits await their viewing. Our museum will be the headquarters for the tour and will be open from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m.

There was a good sized crowd at the middle school cafeteria this Monday evening March 26 to hear John Thomas tell about the wildflowers that can be seen in and around Eagle Lake. He showed many beautiful slides, explained how the flower seeds are harvested, and was glad to answer questions from the audience.

Be sure to plan to see the Lissie display which has been completed recently. You will learn that our neighboring town was first called New Philadelphia and how it came to be called Lissie. There are pictures of the church throughout its history, the grain elevator erected in 1906, the railroad station, and the Izenhower house built in 1908. (This was a "pre fab" job from Sears Roebuck).

Also a tribute was noted to the Lissie Hall; and if you have a picture of this building, the folks of that community would like to add it to the display. There are school group pictures and a picture of many of the farm women that lived in that area in the early 1920's. The two widely read books, *A Prairie Kid Grows Up* and *Prairie Kids Never Grow Up* by Ralph McCormick are on display. A beautiful plate, that commemorates the 75th Anniversary of the Lissie Church is a treasured addition.

Lots of us attended the drama *Night Must Fall* which was presented by our own Prairie Edge Players. Congratulations to Dr. Raymond Thomas, the director; Helen Craig, the producer; the stage personnel with their expertise of lighting and sound effects; those in charge of the concession stands; and everyone else who had any part in making the production successful, and this includes all who moved and set up chairs and did clean-up work.
