New minimum wage law now in effect

Commissioner Mary Scott Nabers of the Texas Employment Commission reminded employees recently that the US Department of Labor has released interim final rules governing the sub-minimum training wage provisions of the new minimum wage law. The new law, which went into effect on April 1, 1990, raises the minimum wage to \$3.80 but also provides for a lower training wage of \$3.35 per hour. The training wage will apply only for certain employees under age 20 and can be applied only for 90 days of employment. It will expire March 31, 1993. The new law covers all companies which have an annual business volume of \$500,000 or more, while public agencies, schools, hospitals, and some other businesses will be covered regardless of their annual dollar volume. The training wage will not apply to migrant or seasonal agricultural workers or to non-immigrant agricultural workers who perform temporary or seasonal work. Also, an employer can pay a worker the sub-minimum wage only until that employee reaches the age of 20, after which he or she must be paid at a rate not less than the minimum wage otherwise applicable under the FLSA. Employees who have been paid the training wage for 90 days can be paid the wage an additional 90 days if they work for a different employer, and if that employer provides on-the-job training. The total period that an employee may be employed at the training wage by any combination of employers may not exceed 180 days. In order to meet the training requirements of the rule, an employer must provide "job-specific skills training and personal skills instruction," according to the regulation.

Princt One, and Delmo Leon Warschak for 34 years of service with Precinct Three. Crockett Leyendecker, chairman of the Sequoyan County Committee, reported the committee offered the remaining money in its treasury, \$3,000, to the Commissioners' Court to be used toward the renovation of the fountain on the courthouse lawn, possibly paying for a specific part (such as the sprayer) with a metal plate stating it was donated by the Sequoyan County Committee. If the fountain is not completed within two years or if the Court rejects the offer, then the money would be divided between the three high schools (Eagle Lake, Columbus, Weimar) for scholarships to three students who excel in Social Studies and have no other scholarship offers. For information only, County Judge Lester Cranek read a petition signed by 91 residents from Weimar opposing the location of a proposed gun club range. The petition states several reasons for opposition: in a residential area where a large number of small children live and a licensed day care is located in the vicinity. Judge Cranek said Commissioners Court has no authority to take action since the residents do not live in a subdivision. If these people who have signed the petition lived in a subdivision, Cranek said, then Commissioners Court would be able to take some sort of action. In other matters, Commissioners: -Approved a defensive driving course for Weimar Ambulance Corps Unit 802. -Accepted certificate of insurance from MCI Communications Corp. for work being performed in county. -Read a letter of appreciation from Frelsburg Fire Department for the "generous amount of money planned to be used for equipment." -Amended the construction agreement with Parks and Wildlife Department to extend the expiration date from April 1, 1990 to August 1, 1990 and authorized the advertisement for the park project. The construction would be to replace the boat ramp on the Colorado River Bridge on Hwy. 90A between Eagle Lake and Altair. -Approved the revised air conditioning proposal for the UDC museum, which is an increase of \$995.
