Railroad. Only four games were reported in that year, and all resulted in victories. The two teams that the Canebells played in 1903 were Bay City and Luling. Luling was said to be the best team during the previous three-year period.

Even though the earliest reference to semi-pro baseball in Eagle Lake was reported in the May 15, 1903 edition of the Eagle Lake Headlight, it is known that the city had a serious attitude to baseball prior to this date.

The only team in Eagle Lake in 1903 was named the Canebells which was sponsored by the local Canebelt

of the leading pitchers for the team, and he came from La Grange. As one can see, the Canebells were a team that not only had local talent, but also drafted players from other areas of the country.

Also, in 1903, a new term, "in the box", was introduced. Research indicates that this term refers to what is now commonly known as the pitcher's mound.

Next week's report on 1904 baseball in Eagle Lake will be given.

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
