FIGURE 16. ATTITUDES OF PARENTS TOWARD ADOLESCENT BEER AND MARIJUANA USE

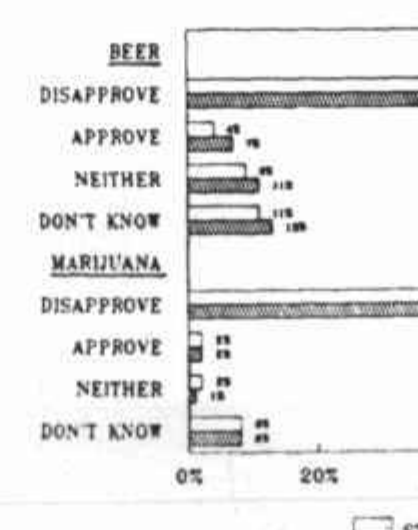


FIGURE 17. PREVALENCE OF 30 DAY SUBSTANCE USE AMONG SECONDARY STUDENTS BY PARENTAL ATTITUDE

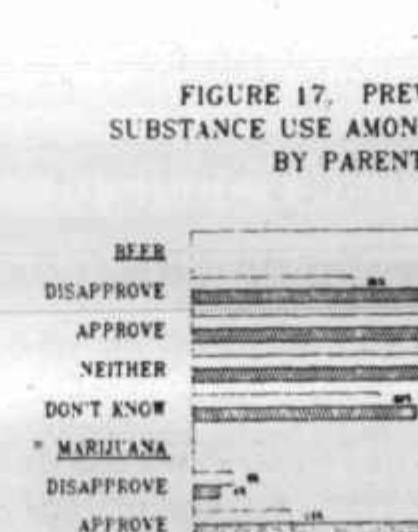


FIGURE 18. ATTITUDES OF PARENTS TOWARD ADOLESCENT BEER AND MARIJUANA USE

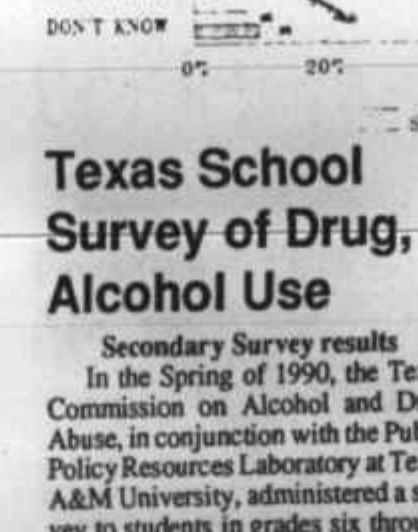
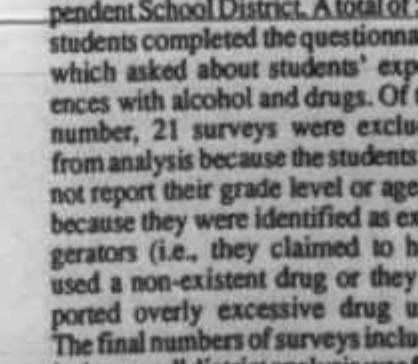


FIGURE 19. PREVALENCE OF 30 DAY SUBSTANCE USE AMONG SECONDARY STUDENTS BY PARENTAL ATTITUDE



Texas School Survey of Drug, Alcohol Use

Secondary Survey results
In the Spring of 1990, the Texas Commission on Alcohol and Drug Abuse, in conjunction with the Public Policy Resources Laboratory at Texas A&M University, administered a survey to students in grades six through twelve in the Rice Consolidated Independent School District. A total of 587 students completed the questionnaire, which asked about students' experiences with alcohol and drugs. Of that number, 21 surveys were excluded from analysis because the students did not report their grade level or age, or because they were identified as exaggerators (i.e., they claimed to have used a non-existent drug or drug use reported overly excessive drug use). The final number of surveys included in the overall district analysis was 566.

Semi-pro baseball in Eagle Lake in 1907

After the first couple of games, it was discovered that the newly formed Posts were, in fact, the old Houston Post newspaper team. This particular year proved to be a better year for baseball, not only in terms actually playing of the game, but also because reporting became more accurate and in-depth. The very first game that the Posts played resulted in an Eagle Lake victory over Wharton with the score of 20 to one. Everyone on the Eagle Lake team had at least two hits. An unfamiliar term was used in this report — the "wind-

mill route" which later became evident as referring to "one that had struck out."

On July 15, the team went to play a series of three games with Yorktown. The first game ended in a squeak with the umpire, a Yorktown man, over "a rank call in the ninth inning." Eagle Lake "quit the field and took the first train out of Yorktown."

The Yorktown paper sent a story to the Houston Chronicle which stated that, "Eagle Lake was dreaming of a walkover, but in fact, they finally realized that Yorktown was the hottest proposition they had gone up against this season."

Another report that same week gave an in-depth report. "The game situation was bottom of the ninth, two outs, a runner was on third, and the score was 2 to 1 in Eagle Lake's favor. The batter had one strike and bunted the ball foul. The umpire ruled the batter safe at first, and the runner that was on third scored." All Eagle Lake asked for was that Yorktown give them the game with a score of 2 to 1. The umpire would not hear of this, and since Eagle Lake would not take the field, the score was posted a victory for Yorktown with the score being 9 to

0. (This becomes the official score in a forfeit situation.)

Toward the end of the season, a new team came to Eagle Lake called the Frazzar's Colts. Not much was known about this team except that they had a 1 and 1 record.

The Posts ended the season with eleven wins, three losses, and one forfeit. To date, the Posts have been Eagle Lake's most successful team that has been reported.
