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Antibiotics: Effective Infection Fighters

Because of their ability to interfere with or stop the growth of infection-causing bacteria, antibiotics are among the most valuable of all the prescription medicines. Antibiotics commonly prescribed include tetracycline, the penicillins (includes ampicillin and amoxycillin), the aminoglycosides, erythromycin, and the cephalosporins. A relatively new group of antibiotics, referred to as the quinolones, are gaining in popularity because of their ability to treat some infections that previously required intravenous antibiotic administration.

Any one or several of many bacteria may be responsible for a particular infection. Since all bacteria do not respond to the same antibiotic, the bacteria should be identified. The identification of bacteria in the body is determined through a test known as a culture. Often antibiotic medicines are not started until the results of the culture are known. If the organism identified is a virus, antibiotics may not be prescribed at all. Viruses such as those that cause the common cold do not respond to antibiotic therapy. All antibiotics should be taken as prescribed by the physician in order to receive the maximum therapeutic benefit and to prevent the emergence of resistant organisms.

GCMC's new lab to be first for area counties

May 8, Gulf Coast Medical Center's (GCMC) 10:30 a.m. groundbreaking marked the beginning of the first heart catheterization lab between Houston and Victoria and within the hospital's seven county service area.

For the groundbreaking presentation, GCMC and South Texas Medical Clinics, P.A., (STMC) employees and members of the local business and medical community gathered at the cardiac catheterization lab construction site. GCMC Chairman of the Board, Jeffrey D. Blair, started the ceremony with a warm welcome and GCMC Director of Operations and Deacon with Holy Family Center Catholic Church in Wharton, Alvin Matthys, gave the invocation. Several

speakers remarked on the benefits this sophisticated medical service will bring to the community and surrounding counties. These individuals included City of Wharton Mayor, Garland Novasud, D.D.S.; Wharton Chamber of Commerce President, Joe Sverick; GCMC Chief Executive Officer, Craig Watson; STMC Cardiologist, Carlos D. Zorrilla, M.D. and GCMC Cardiologist, Jeffrey D. Blair.

Throughout 1991, GCMC, a Healthtrust Inc. employee-owned hospital, is celebrating the five year anniversary of the present healthcare facility's opening. This groundbreaking announcement confirms GCMC's ongoing mission to provide patients with the latest technology in specialized medical care. Spearheaded by future heart catheterization lab medical director, Dr. Zorrilla, the hospital board of trustees and Healthtrust Southwest Region management, this project is the outcome of several years planning and evaluation of service area need.

The completed facility is estimated to be \$1.1 million undertaking. This figure includes building construction costs and installation of state-of-the-art imaging equipment. By August, 1991, GCMC's new cardiac catheterization lab should be finished and will bring advanced cardiac imaging technology closer to home for residents of Wharton and the surrounding counties.

As the American population ages (as have the people of the Gulf Coast area) heart catheterization has increased in its importance as a diagnostic and treatment tool in the field of cardiology. The precise information heart catheterization provides has helped individuals of all ages, especially those in the 45-65 age group. The advantages of GCMC's cardiac catheterization lab are that it will be constructed as an addition to the hospital and is conveniently located adjacent to STMC.

Long-time GCMC Radiology Director Fred Mendez will assist Dr. Zorrilla in the operation of the cardiac catheterization lab. Presently Dr. Zorrilla and his patients must travel to Houston for this procedure.

Cardiac catheterization is a method used to help detect heart problems by using a catheter (thin flexible tube) that is passed painlessly through a main blood vessel to the heart. A contrast medium is injected through the catheter to highlight arterial blockage.

Many factors contribute to seasonal allergies

People who suffer from seasonal allergies already know that the season started early this year.

Their sneezing, itching and congestion told them so. "The pollen that brings misery to sufferers appeared early due to a mild winter," said Dr. David P. Huston, associate professor of medicine at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston.

"Of course, some people suffer almost year round from such allergies because they live in temperate climates where the pollen count remains high most of the time," Huston said.

In temperate areas, tree pollens usually are heavy in March, succeeded in the coming months by other pollens. January and February are relatively irritant-free for many areas.

"Air pollution compounds the problem," Huston said. "Chemicals and smoke can definitely aggravate allergy symptoms." Some people are afflicted with perennial allergies in addition to seasonal allergies.

"These are the people allergic to things which, unlike a specific pollen, are present in their environments year-round," Huston said. Many people are allergic to the dander of animals they keep in their homes. Others have what is commonly called a dust allergy but is in fact a reaction to contaminants found in dust. Roaches and mites contribute heavily to this.
