The men of the Garwood Lions Club held a special meeting last Wednesday in the Garwood School Cafeteria. The purpose of the community meeting was to present public views and questions concerning the proposed hazardous waste landfill near Altair. Lion President Kenny Danklefs and committeemen Parke Christenberry and Billy Hefner went to great pains to contact practically every official with any interest in this matter and invite them to this event.

Tricil, which is the company planning the landfill, was represented by Vice-President James O'Neal, General Manager of Field Services Donald Pouch and Communications Officer Tony Shelton.

The Texas Water Commission was represented by Dan Eden, director of hazardous and solid waste division and Jennifer Mitchell, public affairs division.

A wide variety of county and local officials also attended. Colorado County Judge Butch Strunk and Wharton County Judge L.J. Irvin spoke. Ken Bryan from Representative Greg Laughlin's office was present. County Commissioners Otto Loessin, Sonny Spanihel and Jerome Wick attended. Bob Stallman, state director of Farm Bureau, Herbert Engstrom of Soil and Water Conservation Service, Tom Hudco of the Colorado County Water Council, Bill West of L.C.R.A., Raymond Korenek of Colorado Co. A.S.C.S., Rice CISD Superintendent Carolyn McGaughey and John Matthews, Frederick Leopold and Kate Labay (Rice Board member) also attended.

A Tricil representative presented plans for the hazardous waste landfill and then fielded questions from the crowd.

For about two hours the public expressed their concerns and voiced opinions concerning the dangers of such a landfill. Public officials were quizzed and offered statements based on their knowledge and perception of the problem.

There were still a lot of questions unanswered and citizens unconvinced at the meeting's conclusion, but at least the opportunity for discussion was given. Thanks to the Tricil people for coming and bravely fielding some tough questions.

Thanks to these public officials who attended for their support and thanks to the public for voicing their concern. And a special thanks to the Lions and president Kenny Danklefs for organizing this event and taking such an active role in the welfare of our community.
