## Foot Facts

## PURE CORNS

Corns can be a problem for people of all ages. Generally, a corn develops on a spot where the shoe rubs the top of a toe, or where one toe rubs against another. The corn is a layer of thickened skin which develops to protect the area. The hard, central core of the corn actually kills the cells below it in a conical shape over the point of pressure or shoe irritation. The deeper it grows, the more painful it will be, especially if it presses on a nerve. Since the cause of a corn is usually badly fitted shoes or, history, changing to a different style or a large size will probably help relieve the pressure. Most corns need surgical removal. Over-the-counter corn removal products are caustic and can cause serious burns. Do-it-yourself corn trimming is even more dangerous. Your podiatrist can remove corns safely and with minimum discomfort.

Walking can burn off calories, exercise feet, leg and abdominal muscles, and relieve tension. P.S. Corns pressing on toe joints can cause bursitis, an inflammation of the fluid-filled sac surrounding the joint.

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
