In the near future Prairie Edge Museum will be the meeting site for the Annual Tri-city Commissioners Court, City Councils and Mayors Meeting of Columbus, Eagle Lake, and Weimar. Members and their spouses will be invited to attend. The meal will be catered.

Roseanne Harrison has loaned us a copy of the magazine *Traditional Home*, which contains the very intriguing article entitled "Amazing Grace." For centuries elegant and alluring fans were the most revealing extension of the European women who held them. Such materials as ivory, mother-of-pearl and paper were used in the construction of fans. Years ago many aristocratic women were schooled from childhood in the proper handling of fans, though they were rarely taught to read or write. This interesting magazine will be placed in the case exhibiting a number of fans, and I shall turn the pages several times so that you may see the eight fans pictured. Remember this also: A replica of a 1902 Sears Roebuck catalogue is in the display case and is opened to the two pages showing fans. Plan to see this exhibit soon.
