Pilot's family visits, relays thanks to community

Dear Editor and residents of Eagle Lake:

Last Wednesday morning the day seemed to be starting out as any other work day starts. This was until people heard a loud explosion and looked in the air to see a plane burning and falling to the ground. Tragedy and horror seem to explain the sight of the crash as people came upon the location of the plane.

No one knows when accidents and emergency situations such as this may arise in our area that would lead to a need for an abundance of people to address it. But let me assure you the local people of all surrounding area, that as I stood nearby the site of the crash, we had great volunteer emergency, volunteer fire and medical personnel in our communities. These people responded in a very short period of time after the crash had been called in and were ready to address the situation.

Reports from the site immediately relayed that lives had been lost and no

survivors had been found. This then led to a very intense investigation to determine the cause of the crash as pieces from the plane had been found on both sides of the river.

Then as we heard the list of the crew and passengers it was tragic to learn the number of people on board that had lost their lives and to think of the families they left behind.

On Friday, we had visitors to our home, the family of Captain Patridge (his parents, and his sister and her husband) wanted to see just how bad the crash had been and where their son had lost his life. To our family this was hard and surely the worst of circumstances for a visit, but we felt they had seen all they wanted to see and had come to peace with themselves after the visit. They told us many great stories of how their son had interest in flying when he was young and was indeed a great pilot that loved his job and being with his family.

We relayed to the family that we have great emergency and fire volunteer groups in our communities. If upon arrival to the crash, if there had been any survivors, we felt the best way there to administer the needed medical attention. Brad Patridge's family asked that we relay to all those involved in the volunteer and auxiliary work the family's appreciation for all that had been done.

The Patridge family were great people and this leads our family to believe their son had been a great individual. They will miss their son and we ask you to keep this family, as well as the families of the other victims, in your thoughts and prayers.

The next time you see a volunteer fireman or emergency volunteer, tell them what a good job they are doing for us.

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Billy Clemons announces bid to unseat Lewis in '93

East Texas state Rep. Billy Clemons announced he is a candidate to unseat indicted, five-term Texas House Speaker Gib Lewis in the next legislative convening in 1993.

Clemons, a Democrat from Polk, sharply criticized Lewis for stalling or killing bills without debate.

"There is no democracy in the House," Clemons said, and he referred to Lewis' secret calendars committee as "a secret killing machine."

Clemons said that committee, Lewis, who has yet to declare he will run for a sixth term as speaker, declined to comment on Clemons' bid.

Lewis was indicted by a grand jury in December on ethics charges and faces a pretrial hearing this month or early October.

He has denied the charges, but obviously his political future depends on the outcome of the indictment.

Clemons, Maybhe Others
Clemons did not reveal the names

of lawmakers who support him against Lewis, perhaps to spare them retaliation.

Most Capitol observers believe Clemons' support is thin, but the symbolism of a member challenging Lewis fuels speculation that the underground anti-Lewis movement is

stirring of America to return millions in alleged illegal claims payments from the state Crime Victims' Compensation Program.

The AG's office said PIA contracts with Recovery Line Inc. to find crime victims for counseling who are eligible for crime victims benefits.

But PIA paid \$155,000 a month in overhead costs for Recovery Lines. Morales contends the two "are essentially one entity."

A state district judge restrained PIA affiliates from "bounty hunting" for crime victims through illegal finders fees and referrals.

Private Prisons Clash
The chairman of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice, Selden Hale III, said private prisons built with funds raised by Texas Treasurer Ray Bailey Hutchison's husband are illegal.

Hutchison urges use of private prisons. Her husband, former lawmaker and state GOP chairman Ray Hutchison, was bond counsel for a private \$12.3 million prison construction project.

Hale, appointed this year by Gov. Ann Richards, said those prisons are sanctioned according to the Ruiz federal lawsuit criteria.

The treasurer responded that Hale is a "prison system bureaucrat. Anyone with common sense knows it's better to put criminals in a prison than release them to city streets."

Cornyn, Two-Job Judge
Texas Supreme Court Justice John Cornyn drew fire for earning two state paychecks; he makes \$91,035 a year as justice and \$18,000 as judge of the 4th Administration Judicial Region.

Cornyn, a Republican, said he enjoys the administrative judge job; revised law allows him to hold both jobs, but Democrat lawmakers want him to give up the lesser job.

Suzi Woodford of Common Cause, a citizens watchdog group, said he risks a conflict of interest because he can appoint judges to hear cases he might hear later himself on the High Court.

Morales: Cap and Suit
Attorney General Dan Morales said he will take further action to remove the 95 percent occupancy cap for Texas prisons if U.S. District Judge William Wayne Justice and San Francisco lawyer William Bennett Turner, who represents Texas prisoners, don't agree to lift it.

Morales also used Psychiatric Institute to sue for \$1 million over the next two years.

Most of the questions about the new plan have dealt with contentions that the budget was written in such a manner as to thwart the governor's ability of veto "line items," wherein even the smallest expenditures and individual salaries are appropriated as specific items.

It is true that in this budget there is — to some degree — a greater "lumping" together of similar spending items within each agency's budget. That is nothing more than a continuation of the "program" budgeting that

has been followed for the past 10 or 15 years.

History shows that extensive use of "line items" didn't save money. But it did act as a straightjacket wherein even the best agency management often found itself with money being spent on one line item area while another area of more critical need went unserved.

That happened under the old system because management was powerless to manage resources as needs changed. But the new budget system brings with it a lot more good management tools than just flexibility.

Consider:
1. For the first time ever, each appropriation carries with it a mandate of specific performance achievements the Legislature expects for the money allocated.

2. For the first time ever, the Legislative Budget Board is empowered to join the governor in implementing budget execution laws wherein money can actually be taken away from agencies.

3. For the first time ever, the agencies are required to cut \$300 million

Some changes in taxes affecting you

The Texas Legislature recently made changes in state tax law. Since the Comptroller's Office collects most state taxes, we receive a lot of questions about how these changes will affect taxpayers. Here are some of the most frequently asked questions:

Q: I'm looking at buying a used 16-foot bass boat. The guy I'm buying it from isn't in the boat business. Do I have to pay any tax?

A: Starting Oct. 1, you'll be required to pay a new 6.25% sales tax on the price of any new or used boat. The new tax also applies to the outboard motor you need to move the boat around the lake.

All sales — except boat dealers — will be subject to tax. That means tax will be due even when a boat or motor is purchased from an individual who does not have a tax permit.

This new tax applies to all boats up to 65 feet in length that are used for recreation.

The tax will be paid to your local (See Tax Facts, Page 15)
