**LOCKER ROOM LOOKOUT**

You need to be athletically inclined to get athlete's foot. A fungus infection, it loves warm, moist places like the floor of the locker room and the cracks between your toes. As the kids head back to school and back to gym class, they are more prone to pick up the fungus, just as Mom and Dad are when they shower after a workout at the health club or take a dip in the country club pool. However you acquire it, common symptoms include drying skin, itching, scaling, inflammation, and blisters or cracks between the toes. Athlete's foot can be spread to other warm, moist parts of the body by those who scratch the infection and then touch themselves elsewhere. Treatment is most effective when combined with good foot hygiene. Keeping feet clean and dry helps them. Your podiatrist can prescribe anti-fungal medications that are more effective than most over-the-counter remedies. If you do frequent a gym or locker room, be sure to wear sandals and wash and dry your feet completely. ## Company matches students with funds

Over \$100 million in scholarship funds went unclaimed last year because students and parents did not know how to tap into these resources. A National Company, using computer matching is now making this possible.
