Below is the resolution passed by Commissioners' Court concerning hazardous waste disposal: RESOLUTION OPPOSING HAZARDOUS WASTE WHEREAS, the Commissioners' Court of Colorado County in order to protect the surface water, the ground water, and our Colorado River from any possible contamination; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners' Court opposes the issuance of any hazardous waste permit by the Texas Water Commission, the Texas Department of Health, to any person or entity whose application for such a permit indicates that the site upon which the applicant's hazardous waste facility is to be located is on land under which there is a fresh water sand less than two hundred (200) feet; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners' Court opposes the issuance of any hazardous waste permit to any person or entity whose application for such a permit indicates that the site upon which the

applicant's hazardous waste facility is within five (5) statute miles of the nearest cut bank of the Colorado River; and

THEREFORE, IT BE RESOLVED: That this Commissioners' Court meeting this 14th day of October, 1991, does hereby go on record as opposing any hazardous facility until such time as the Environmental Protection Agency of the United States shall certify that the proposed waste facility can be constructed in such a fashion that it will never leak.

The above Resolution was moved by Commissioner L.J. "Sonny" Spanish and seconded by Commissioner Johnnie Elstner and unanimously adopted by the Commissioners' Court of Colorado County, Texas, meeting in Regular Session on this 14th day of October, 1991.
