

Texas Sportsman's Association 'Fall Gathering' is a success

The Texas Sportsman's Association had a highly successful Fall Gathering with over 450 people attending, Sept. 29. The gathering was held in the Industry Fireman's Hall.

Guest speakers for the event included Ronnie Boston, Resource and Conservation Development Coordinator with the Soil Conservation Service in Victoria; Dr. Larry Varner, nutritionist for Purina Mills in Gonzales; and Game Warden Lt. Sam Center, supervisor of an eight county area including Austin County.

Glenn Weishuhn, president; Henry Beyer, vice president; Mary Rinn, secretary; Leslie Heinsohn, corresponding secretary; and Paul Hattermann, treasurer.

Both Boston and Varner discussed wildlife habitat in general. Boston covered plans for managing ranchland to accommodate livestock and wildlife. Dr. Varner discussed supplemental feeding of wildlife, notably to increase deer size and antler development. Center covered game laws that affect the area and asked members of the association to assist wardens in apprehending poachers.

An exciting auction followed. A blackbuck antelope hunt, a Corsican ram hunt, a feral hog hunt, a wildlife

quilt, hunting equipment, a 600 pound heifer, a picnic table and benches and many other fine items brought excellent prices. L.J. Rinn, chairman of the auction committee, was impressed by the generosity of the many donors and buyers. He said, "It really makes the auctioneer's job easier when you are dealing with the fine people involved in this organization."

After the auction, the crowd enjoyed the delicious hunters' stew prepared by the committee chaired by "Buck" Kollmann and Dalby Mike-ska.

Rice Raiders drop the ball to Bellville

The Rice Raiders were defeated last Friday night 44-7 by the Bellville Brahmas. This puts the Raiders' season record at 0 wins and 7 losses.

The Raiders started slow again by giving up a safety. On a punting situation, the punter jumped for a high snap and landed on the back of the end zone. "We tried to catch them in a situation where they could not rush our punter and get a possible block and touchdown," commented Coach Johnson.

The Raiders' defense fell short of stopping the Brahmas. The defense did force three punts for the first time this season. Jerome Haynes led all

defensive players with 8 tackles. Kevin Jackson made 7 and Travis Polach made 5 tackles for the Raider defense.

"Our kickoff return team has a bad time fielding the kickoffs. This put us in deep holes to start our drives," insisted Coach Johnson.

On offense, the Raiders gained a total of 300 yards but two turnovers and mental mistakes on long drives prevented them from getting close to score. The Raiders scored on their next to last drive as Reginald Donner

ran three yards over good blocks by Melvin Johnson, Marcus Dugins and Mark Johnson.

"Reggie had a good game tonight. He blocked better, ran harder and picked up 194 yards on the ground," said Coach Johnson.

The linemen of the week was Corey Leopold with a 53% grade. Coach Johnson commented, "Corey has been working hard on his technique. This young man has improved

on his knowing who to block at all times. Plus, he has been working on staying low enough to drive his man off the line of scrimmage."

Defensive player of the week was Jerome Haynes for the second week in a row. Haynes led the team in tackles.

Offensive player of the week was Reginald Donner. He earned this honor by running the ball 35 times for 194 yards and 1 touchdown.

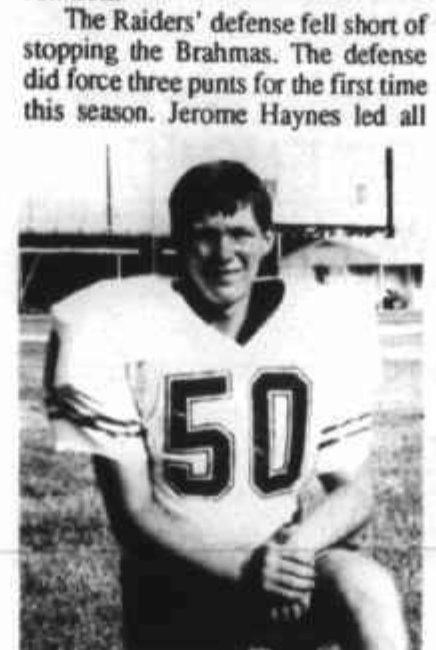
