

Water conservation awards given at Garwood ceremony

The sixth annual Garwood Irrigation Company Water Conservation Awards were presented Friday, Oct. 11th, in the meeting room of the Lehigh Interest facilities in Garwood.

Each year awards in the form of \$250 and \$750 are presented to the top water conserving farmers on each canal rider's system. Based on a point system that encompasses the rice watering season from beginning to end, two winners emerge each year for each canal rider on the Garwood Irrigation canal system. There is a winner for fields under 150 acres and one for over 150 acres. These farmers are not

selected but earn the award by their performance based on a point system. This year's recipients were:

• on canal rider David Baird's system, under 150, H&S Rice, Inc. (147.4 acres); over 150, HF Rice, Inc. (154.38 acres).
• Jeff Wied's system, under 150 acres, 3K Farms, Inc. (1317.71 acres); over 150, E.L. Wied (150.65 acres).
• Todd Krenke's system, under 150, Leon and Tommy Cranek (61.88 acres); over 150, Hunt and Smith (344.18 acres).
• Company President William N. Lehrer was on hand to extend his

congratulations to the winners and praise their water conserving efforts. Citing the ample rainfall during the watering season and concerted efforts of all the competitors of the canal system as positive factors in 1991, Lehrer informed the group present that 4.50 acre feet per acre had been pumped by the company on a first crop of 20,247.62 acres and a second crop of 19,544.68 acres.

The awards serve as a positive factor to help cut water usage. Garwood Irrigation plans to continue these awards annually as it strives to find even better methods to improve

Rice Raiders crushed by Sealy, 63-6

The Raider varsity was defeated by the Sealy Tigers last Friday night at Raider Stadium. Sealy was stopped by the Raider defense on their first drive. The Tigers scored on their second drive to make the first score of the game 7-0.

The Raiders came right back and scored on an outstanding run by Reginald Donner. The touchdown run covered 30 yards with Donner carrying one tackler the last ten yards of the play. Haynes PAT kick was no good.

With the score 7-6, the Tigers took off and began an offensive show by collecting 609 total yards to the Raiders' 177 yards. At halftime the score was 48-6.

In the second half, the Raiders suffered more than the first half as

they had to watch Sealy kick three third quarter field goals on first downs. "That was very damaging to us and our program. Coach Mills did the right thing and worked on the things he needed to work on. The clock-kill at the end of the game was a class thing for Sealy to do," commented Coach Johnson.

Offensive player of the game was Reggie Donner. He gained 103 yards on the night.

FLAMING FEET

Ever feel as if your feet are on fire? The cause may be as simple as a pair of shoes that don't "breathe" properly, or as serious as diabetic neuropathy, caused by reduced blood flow and nerve degeneration. To avoid shoe-related problems, wear shoes made of natural leather or synthetics designed to allow your feet's perspiration to evaporate. Powder your feet and the insides of your shoes. If burning stops soon after removing shoes or occurs on just one foot, the problem may be a pinched nerve from an injury or poorly fitting shoe. Socks can also cause painful burning. Wear the new synthetic fibers that pull moisture away from feet. Athlete's foot is another well-known cause of burning feet. Perhaps less well-known is contact dermatitis, the technical term for allergies feet develop to things they touch.

Test your feet kindly by wearing clean, comfortable socks and shoes. Please call my office for further information or for an appointment, at the Eagle Lake Community Hospital at 409-234-5571.
