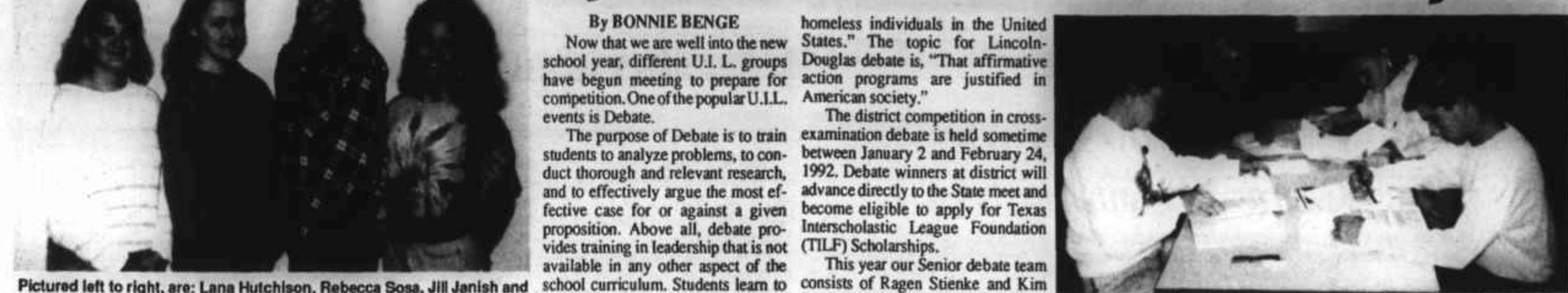

The purpose of Debate is to train students to analyze problems, to conduct thorough and relevant research, and to effectively argue the most effective case for or against a given proposition. Above all, debate provides training in leadership that is not available in any other aspect of the school curriculum. Students learn to think critically, make quick responses, defend worthy ideas and attack invalid ones. It can also teach students to accept other points of view and in some cases to work together.

Each year the debate team is given a resolution or topic for debate. The problem area for this year is, "What should be done to meet the needs of the homeless in the United States?" The topic for team debate is, "That the federal government should significantly increase social services to

homeless individuals in the United States." The topic for Lincoln-Douglas debate is, "That affirmative action programs are justified in American society."

The district competition in cross-examination debate is held sometime between January 2 and February 24, 1992. Debate winners at district will advance directly to the State meet and become eligible to apply for Texas Interscholastic League Foundation (TILF) Scholarships.

This year our Senior debate team consists of Ragen Stienke and Kim Powers participating in team debate. The Novice team consists of Shari Grahmann with Kelli Thompson and Meredith Anderson with Chris Burrow. If Chris decides not to compete, then Meredith will be the only member participating in Lincoln-Douglas or solo debate. The debate team is headed by Mrs. Holden and they are now preparing for their first meet on November 16, in Wharton. These students are currently hard at work preparing for the district meet.
