Armbrister seeking third term

State Senator Ken Armbrister has officially announced he will seek a third term in the Texas Senate. The democrat from Victoria said, "Crime is going to be a top priority during the next session and I plan to use my background in law enforcement to make sure our streets are safe again."

Armbrister said it's time juvenile offenders that commit violent crime are treated as the criminals they are. "The juvenile code needs to be changed so we can lock up these teenage gang members and keep them from selling drugs on our streets and attacking our families."

Armbrister has 14 years experience in law enforcement as a member of the Victoria Police Department. He is also a graduate of the FBI National Academy and has twice been named as a top ten legislative crime fighter.

Recently Armbrister was named as chairman of the Interim Committee on Senate Finance by Lieutenant Governor Bob Bullock, and to the Interim Committee on Government Efficiency.
