Kim is the daughter of Clark and Vicki Powers of Eagle Lake.

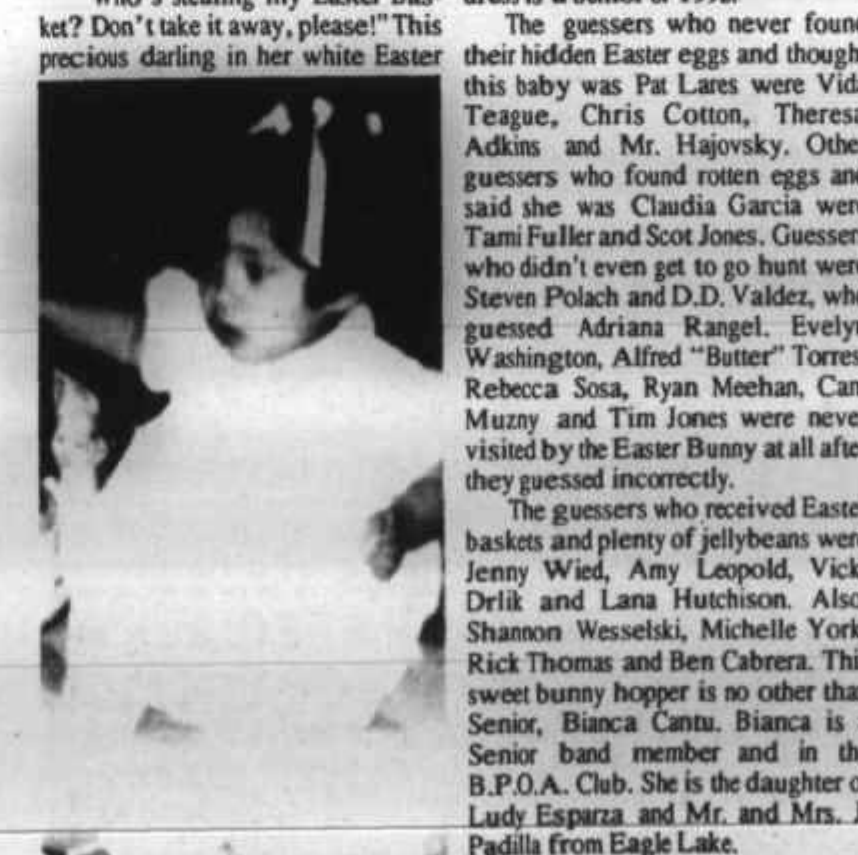
## Meet the Raiders
