"Individuals and business owners who have suffered damage in the ongoing flooding should call 1-800-462-9029 to contact FEMA and to make an initial request for assistance," Gramm said.

FEMA will accept applications not only from the five counties already declared as disaster areas, but from flooded areas throughout the

state. The FEMA representatives will be available to explain the full range of federal assistance including direct grants, low interest loans and temporary housing. They can answer questions and take the information necessary to apply for all these programs over the phone.
