Area code 512 to split in November of 1992

A new area code, 210, will serve San Antonio area and Rio Grande Valley telephone customers beginning in November 1992, according to the Southwestern Bell Telephone manager, Audrey Fossier. All communities in the San Antonio and Brownsville service areas will change from 512 area code to the new 210 area code at that time.

Austin and Corpus Christi telephone service areas will remain in the 512 area code. The changeover will take place in two stages. For the six months from Nov. 1, 1992, to May 2, 1993, customers who accidentally dial the 512 code number will be made in the customers' phone numbers. The seven digit number for each customer will remain the same, as will long distance rates and dialing methods.
