'It has been estimated that 5% of persons over 65 and 20% of those 85 and older manifest problems seriously enough to require assistance' for dementia. The frequency of these symptoms almost doubles with every five years after the age of 65.
Severe dementia could be present in 1.0 to 9.1% of the aged population. Mild dementia could be present in 2.6 to 15.4%.
Those nurses that specialize in gerontological nursing are more attuned to the needs for those suffering from dementia. Nurses at Heritage House are continually monitoring residents to detect any slight change in behavior or medical condition.

participant's income and social security number and naming that person as the authorized representative. The authorized representative is then certified to represent the participant and may receive the participant's commodities without a permission note.
If a person picking up the commodities for another participant is not the authorized representative named on the application, that person must have a permission note from the participant to pick up the commodities every time he receives the commodities. The Community Action Center cannot distribute commodities without the proper certification or without the signed permission note from a certified participant. These guidelines are a requirement of the Texas Department of Human Resources, Emergency Food Assistance Program.
