School Board votes 5-1 not to renew Sanders' contract

The Rice Consolidated Independent School District board of trustees agreed not to renew the contract of a teacher-coach, awarded one-year term contracts to 118 educators, accepted the resignation of two teachers and an administrator and named a substitute teacher following an approximate three-hour executive session Monday night.

In a 5-1 vote, the board elected not to renew the contract of Jack Sanders, a teacher-coach at Eagle Lake Middle School. With Trustee Reggie Brisco not in attendance, Melody Grigar cast the lone vote against Sanders' non-renewal.

The board also accepted the resignation of Assistant Superintendent

Paul Harris, who is in charge of finance and business services, and teacher-coach Graylyn Boyd, high school volleyball coach, and the retirement request of Rice High School Librarian Lillian Gohlke.

In other personnel matters, the board voted to award one-year term contracts to 35 educators at Rice High School, 31 at Eagle Lake Middle School, 21 at Eagle Lake Primary

School, 14 at Sheridan School, 13 at Garwood School and four in the district's special education cooperative.

Trustees also approved the addition of Rhonda Anderson as a substitute teacher in the district.

The board approved the election sites and officials for the May 2 election in which there are two positions open on the board—Place 4 occupied by John Matthews and Place 5 chaired by John Carey.

The voting sites are Eagle Lake Community Center in Eagle Lake, Garwood School in Garwood and Sheridan School in Sheridan.

Four jailers to be hired...

Jail problem faces Commissioners, Sheriff

Colorado County Commissioners' Court discussed its pending jail overcrowding problem during Monday morning's regular meeting and following an emergency meeting with Sheriff Bill Esterling the next day agreed to hire four jailers.

Jack Crump, executive director of the Texas Commission on Jail Standards, recently wrote County Judge H.O. "Butch" Strunk and outlined needs the county is facing.

"Your first area of review must be the need for adequate staff," Crump said.

"Minimum jail standards require that 1) inmates be observed by a jailer at least once each hour; 2) be supervised by an officer provided on each floor when 10 or more inmates are housed; and 3) be supervised in increments of one officer per 48 inmates.

"Due to the (layout...three stories) of the Colorado County Jail and its current population, there is only one obvious solution.

"Specifically that is 1) maintain an officer on the third level; 2) reduce the population to nine or less on the second level; and 3) insure required observation is provided.

"The most obvious way to deal with (current and future incarceration needs) is through the creation of additional space. Based on the jail's population...
