

St. Mary's, Nada, is site of Schoellmann, Pratho wedding

A double ring ceremony united Carol Rose Schoellmann and Curtis Ray Pratho in marriage Saturday afternoon, Feb. 29.

The wedding took place at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Nada. The nuptial mass was celebrated by the Rev. Edward R. Schoellmann, M.M. of Nada, uncle of the bride; and Rev. Mr. Victor Schmidt, pastor of St. Mary's. Rev. Schoellmann officiated at the marriage ceremony.

Carol is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Walter F. Schoellmann of Nada. The groom is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Willie G. Pratho of Houston. Grandmother of the bride is Mrs. F.M. Schoellmann of Nada.

The church was decorated for the ceremony with elegant white floral arrangements on the main altar flanked by candelabra entwined with greenery. A unity candle stood near the front of the sanctuary. White and purple satin bows with ivory decorated the pews down the center aisle.

Mrs. Cynthia Georg, organist, played an interlude of traditional wedding and classical music as guests were being seated. She accompanied soloist Sam Labay as he sang "He, One Hand, One Heart" and "Sunrise, Sunset." Mrs. Labay also sang "Bridal Prayer," "Ave Maria" and "The Lord's Prayer" during the mass.

The bride was escorted to the altar by her father to the processional, "Trumpet Voluntary." She wore a white satin gown designed by Angelina for her wedding. The bodice was embellished with Alencon lace, pearls and sequins. It featured a v-neck outlined in lace and a basque waist defined with satin cording. The long tapered sleeves were accented with cutout lace motifs and formed lace

points over the hands. The back featured a bow with a satin rose outlined in pearls. Alencon lace appliques accented with pearls and sequins swept diagonally across the front of the ballroom skirt which flowed into a train accented with lace appliques. The hem of the skirt was edged with Alencon lace, sequins and pearls.

The bride's headpiece, fashioned of Alencon lace, pearls and sequins, held a tier of fingertip length sparkle illusion accented with pearls and a second tier which flowed beyond her train.

The bride carried a cascade of red roses and purple statice accented with baby's breath and ivy. A rosary belonging to her grandmother was entwined in the bouquet. A pearl necklace from her mother, pearl earrings, her grandmother's wedding ring and a blue garter completed the traditional bridal attire.

The Colorado Valley Transit takes a brand new name and look during March when it becomes a member of the new statewide TRAX rural transportation network, announced executive director Vastene Olier.

A new logo showing a friendly little bus zooming into the word TRAX will be incorporated into Colorado Valley Transit's advertising, schedules, signs, vehicles and other marketing materials.

The TRAX network is a new group of 40 existing rural bus systems across Texas. Coordinated through the Texas Dept. of Transportation (TxDOT), it aims to heighten awareness and use of public transportation in services in rural areas, said Richard G. Christie, TxDOT Public Transportation Director.

To help promote the new system, there will be a major advertising campaign. Locally, the radio and TV spots will be supported by several promotions. Starting March 23, the first 250 riders will receive a promotional van magnet as a reminder of their service.

"We are enthusiastic about the opportunity to let people know more about our service. It truly is for everyone in the Colorado County area," said Olier.

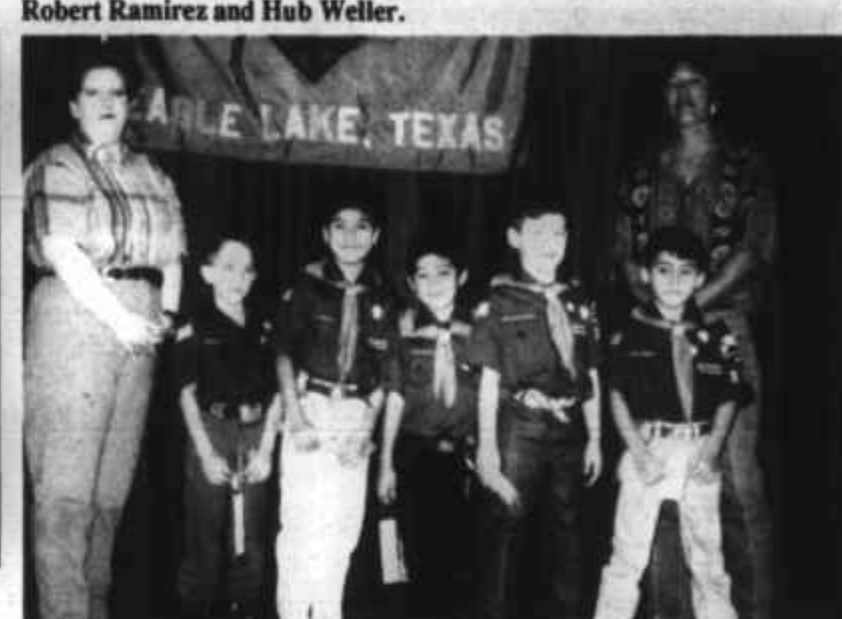
