

THE PROBLEM WITH "WET FEET"

"Getting your feet wet" means something entirely different to people who suffer from a disorder of the sweat glands called hyperhidrosis. People with this condition live with stockings and shoes that are almost constantly soaked. Their feet appear pale and macerated. Normal sweating is vital to eliminating body wastes and regulating temperature. However, when feet start sweating heavily for no apparent reason, the cause is usually local trophic nerve dysfunction. Stepped-up hygiene is a part of the treatment, including changing shoes and socks twice a day and thoroughly washing feet with soap and water daily.
