Soil test campaign in progress

Expected yield increases from fertilization are highly dependent on the level of available nutrients present in the soil. A reliable estimate of the nutrient status of the soil is of major importance in deciding about fertilization.

To promote soil testing in Colorado County, the Extension Livestock Committee is sponsoring "Colorado County Soil Test Campaign," Jan. 18-28. During this time soil tests are half-price to all interested individuals. Prices range from \$5 to \$7 depending on the type of test chosen.

Soil sample bags as well as information on how to take a soil sample

can be picked up at the following locations: M-G in Weimar, Farmer's Cooperative Association, Texana Seed and Garwood Implement in Garwood, Heffley's Mill & Grain, Family Feed & Supply in Columbus, Wintemmer Warehouse and Wilbur-Ellis Co. in Eagle Lake, Bernardo Farm & Ranch Supply and Heinsohn's Store in Frelsburg.

All soil samples can be dropped off at any of these locations anytime between Jan. 18-28.

The objective in sampling is to obtain a composite sample that represents soil in the field, garden or lawn to be treated. The following steps will

help insure a good soil sample:

There are several precautions which participants should be aware of:

- Avoid sampling spots in the field such as small gullies, slight field depressions, terrace waterways and unusual spots.
- Do not use old vegetable cans, tobacco cans, match boxes, etc., to submit samples.
- Do not use heat to dry samples. Spread sample out and allow to air dry.
- Be sure to keep record as to the area represented by each sample.

After some concern about future rate increases was expressed by the council, Garrett said that under the provisions of the rider, any losses associated with the EDR will not be used to justify higher rates during the rate increase moratorium now in place.

Costs associated with EDRs may not be passed on to customers until CPL makes such a request in its next general rate case. Cities will be free to oppose allocation of these costs to rate payers in a future proceeding if and when CPL requests recovery of such costs.

Eagle Lake Insurance Associates Inc. was the lone bidder for insurance for electronic equipment and media, building and contents, electric motors and airport liability. The bid of \$4,206 was approved by council, an increase of \$984 over the previous year's expense.

No action was taken on a recommendation by the TxDOT following a speed study to increase the speed limit on U.S. Highway 90A between Johnnie D. Hutchins Drive and Golf Course Road by five miles per hour.

The council requested Holland to communicate with TxDOT prior to the next meeting for more details. Some concern was voiced as to the effect of a speed increase on school traffic.

The subject of street lights not illuminating enough areas was once again brought up by concerned citizens by way of councilmen. Citizens were reminded that street lights are not provided by the city as security lights... but only for the purpose of illuminating intersections.

Council also requested that Holland look into city policy regarding city police officers working out of the city limits.
